- The first restaurant is in Turku but nowadays you can find Hesburger restaurants in Latvia, Lithuania, Bulgaria, Ukraine, Estonia, and Germany.

- Their yearly net sales is 360 million euros

- Neste has almost 4900 employees and it employs people for gas stations, transportations, management, engineering and factories
- Their yearly net sales is 15.1 billion euros
