

Curriculum accommodates a holistic view on education and gives strong pedagogical and practical guidelines for education providers and schools National core curricula and local curricula are drawn up in open, interactive and cooperative processes This ongoing dialogue functions as a learning cycle; helping us:

- to identify the issues to be improved
- to find solutions that best serve teaching and learning
- to promote the commitment of all stakeholders to the curriculum process and the goals set for education




What has changed?

Accoding to Kangasala students



Transversal competences in the core curriculum


Transversal competence refers to the total of knowledge, skills, values, attitudes, capacity and will

- Competence development requires cooperation across school subjects and dealing with the questions pupils find meaningful
- Descriptions of competence have been derived from the government decree and defined in relation to the changes in the operating environment



Transversal competences (7)

- T1 Thinking and learning to learn
- T2 Cultural competence, interaction and self-expression
- T3 Taking care of oneself, managing daily activities, safety
- T4 Multiliteracy
- T5 ICT competence
- T6 Competence required for working life and entrepreneurship
- T7 Participation, involvement and building a sustainable future

- Goals emphasise coherent basic education and integrated teaching






