Listening

- At school in classes
 - Students work individually
 - In English once a week one lesson (45 minutes)
 - Teaching materials include listening comprehension exercises
 - Pieces of news
 - Lectures
 - Short articles read and recorded
 - Interviews
 - Video clips
 - TV programmes
 - Films

Matriculation Examination Listening: 1/3

- Types of Exercises included:
 - Multiple choice questions
 - True/False statements & correcting mistakes
 - Open questions
 - Dictation
 - Filling gaps
 - Summarising the main contents orally
 - Pictures
 - Key words
 - Writing a summary

- Pronunciation exercises:
 - Listen and repeat
 - Practising words in pairs
 - · Reading aloud in pairs

VOCABULARY

Vocabulary

- Finnish used in the exercises
- Students work individually after they have read (and listened to) the text in class:
 - Teacher gives
 - the vocabulary worksheets included in the teacher's material
 - the vocabulary worksheets she/he has made
 - Students work on the vocabulary exercises in the book

VOCABULARY

Types of exercises included:

- finding expressions in the text and writing them down
- translating sentences/short extracts from the text
- synonyms and opposites
- word formation exercises
- paraphrasing
- crossword puzzles
- combining a word and its meaning/synonyms/opposites
- explaining a word in one's own words

READING

Reading

- Students read a text in advance at home
- After listening to the text
 - Students work on a reading comprehension exercise
 - Open questions
 - Multiple choice questions
 - Summary
 - Translation
 - Explainig words
 - Synonyms
 - Opposites
 - Paraphrasing



Reading difficult texts

- The texts in matriculation exams require interpretation:
 - What type of text is it?
 - Potential readers?
 - The aim of the text
 - Style
 - What? Who? To Whom? Where? Why? What followed?

Speaking and conversation

- "What we do we can be done orally"
- Teachers make their own exercises too
- Exercises strictly based on the text:
 - Summarising the text with the help of tips:
 - Pictures
 - Key words
 - Questions
 - Vocabulary Games: Alias, Naughts and Crosses
 - Making up dialogues using the expressions/vocabulary in the text
 - Tips in Finnish
 - Pairs correct themselves
 - Talking crossword puzzles
 - Pair translation

SPEAKING

Speaking and conversation

- Applied exercises:
 - Discussion in pairs
 - Discussion exercises on the themes of the text
 - Expressing one's opinions
 - Argumentation
 - Being polite
 - Role plays
 - Group discussion
 - Games
 - Role plays
 - Dramatising the text/ a situation



National oral test

- Voluntary
- Includes a course
- Test tasks from the National Board of Education
- Evaluation by two teachers or one teacher + recording

GRAMMAR

Grammar and Structures

- Written exercises
 - Translation
 - Filling in the gaps (tips given)
 - Multiple choice
- and oral exercises
 - Choosing phrases and making sentences
 - Translation in pairs
 - Grammar games (naughts and crosses)



Writing

- Writing a different type of texts:
 - Making up dialogues
 - Writing a letter to one of the characters in the text
 - Writing a piece of news on the basis of the text
 - Argumentative text on one of the topics/themes in the text
 - Identifying with one of the characters and writing from her/his point of view
 - Descriptive text on the basis of the text
