Forssan yhteislyseo

Our high school was established in 1899. It's one of the oldest high schools and the oldest countryside high school in Finland. The first students graduated in 1910

Roughly translated Forssan yhteislyseo means Forssa's combined high school. It used to be called Linikkala high school too until it emerged with Kuhala's high school in 1998.

Currently there's about 420 students and 30 teachers in our school.

Studies and curriculum

In our high school we have a sports academy and a visual arts line.

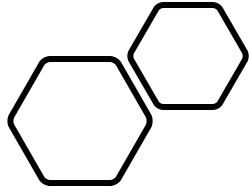
Forssa's high school offers double and triple high school studies for students of Forssa vocational institute and Ypäjä Horse College
