Library content and services – (at least in Norway) the focus changes from collections management and lending books to active dissemination of content, being an arena for debate and public discussion and a meeting place.

- Events and happenings how is it organized in our libraries? What is successful and what has failed? Can we share experiences and get new ideas on how to put together good, interesting programs in our libraries?
- Reading campaigns? For children? For other target groups?
- How do we reach young adults?
- Digital services, e-books how to build good collections, how to make good use of available digital resources and how to reach our users and non-users.

15.15 Debating today's program and topics good/bad, useful, and the group's future organization and meeting frequency.

16.00 End of meeting

We started put by updating each other on the status of our libraries, shared some statistics and made some comparisons. Even though there are differences, many of our challenges are

similar. How to organize staff and services is one question we all are looking into. How to recruit broader, with competencies that are 'new' to libraries was another topic we discussed.

Torill Stokkan shared some of her ideas for next year's Literature Week in Sarpsborg. History will be a main focus. Some of her ideas are to arrange a historical symposium where the discussion will be on how history is written and on sources. Another idea is to focus on fantasy literature, to look into how the Norse heritage influences authors. Tolkien's fascination of the Kalevala is possibly one angel of interest. If the twin town libraries are interested, we can look into a tighter link between the towns literary heritage in next years Literature Week.

The directors decided that we want to continue collaborations, and have set the following plan for 2016:

- 1. We will explore the possibilities of collaborating during Sarpsborg Literature Week.
 - a. Torill Stokkan will present outlines of a project involving fantasy literature, Tolkien, the Finnish language, kalevala
 - b. Maybe it is possible to exchange authors, or at least books from local authors.
 - c. Look into the possibility of streaming events during the Literature Week to libraries in the twin towns.
- 2. The directors will communicate formally via documents etc on the common platform, but informally in a closed facebook group.
- 3. In 2016 Modelprogram for folkebiblioteker (http://modelprogrammer.kulturstyrelsen.dk/) will host a conference in Denmark. The directors wishes all attend this conference, meet up and continue our discussions.
- 4. Exhange program for staff
 - a. Each year during Nordic Library Week (week 46), starting from 2016, staff from all four libraries will visit a twin library for work exchange. The directors are to plan for this and seek funding. The goal is that at least four staff members do one week in a twin library each year.
 - b. The directors also want to develop an exchange program for them selves, to learn from each other and to seek inspiration.
