My history of foreign languages learning

My first contact with foreign language was when I was 3 years old and I started learning English in my kindergarten. Firstly, we were taught by singing songs and declaiming short poems. When we became older (about 4/5 years old) the teacher would read us interesting stories. Each story was the next part of the previous story. I still remember some of them. I continued my English education in primary school - 2 hours weekly in 1-3 class and 3 hours in 4-6 class - and in secondary school 3 hours per week. Now, in high school, I also have 3 hours of English weekly. My parents have provided me with private lessons since I was in the first class of primary school. That has really helped me. I wouldn't speak English as well as now, if I hadn't had/but for these lessons.

Since I was very young I have been travelling a lot with my family. The first time I went abroad was when I was 3 years old. It was a trip to Paris and I don't really remember many facts or places. Since then we have regularly travelled to many countries. It has given me a lot of opportunities to speak foreign languages. I have always bought a local language phrasebook to learn at least the most important words and phrases to be able to communicate abroad.
