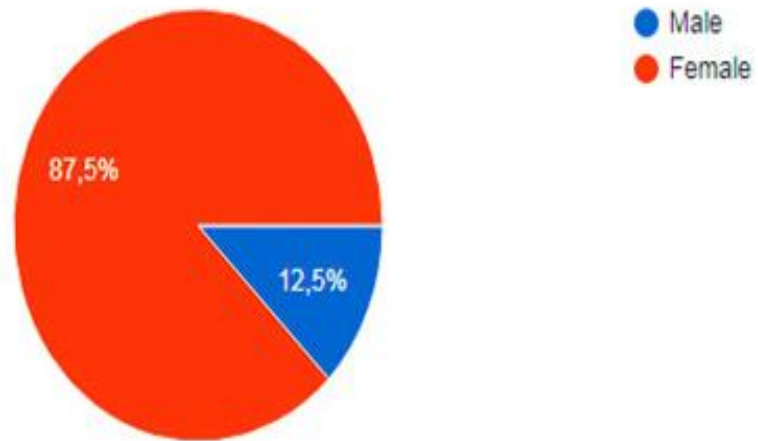

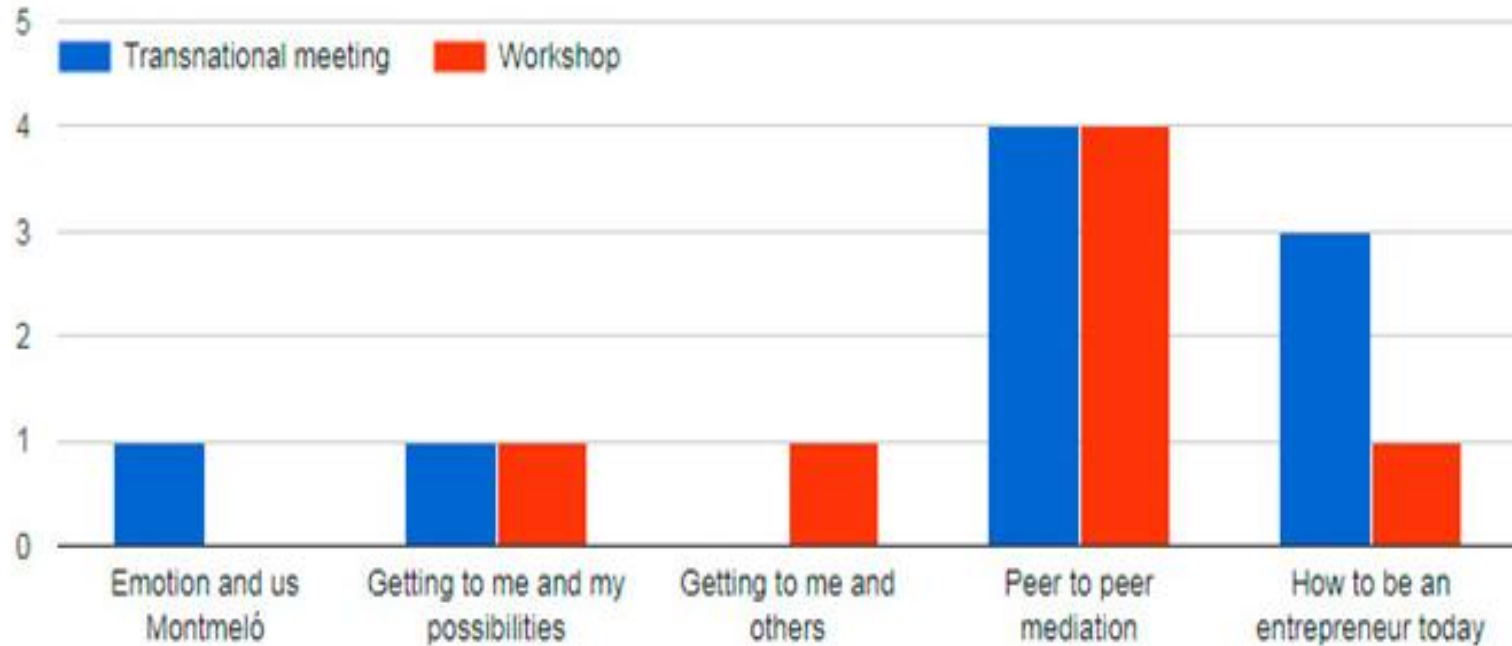

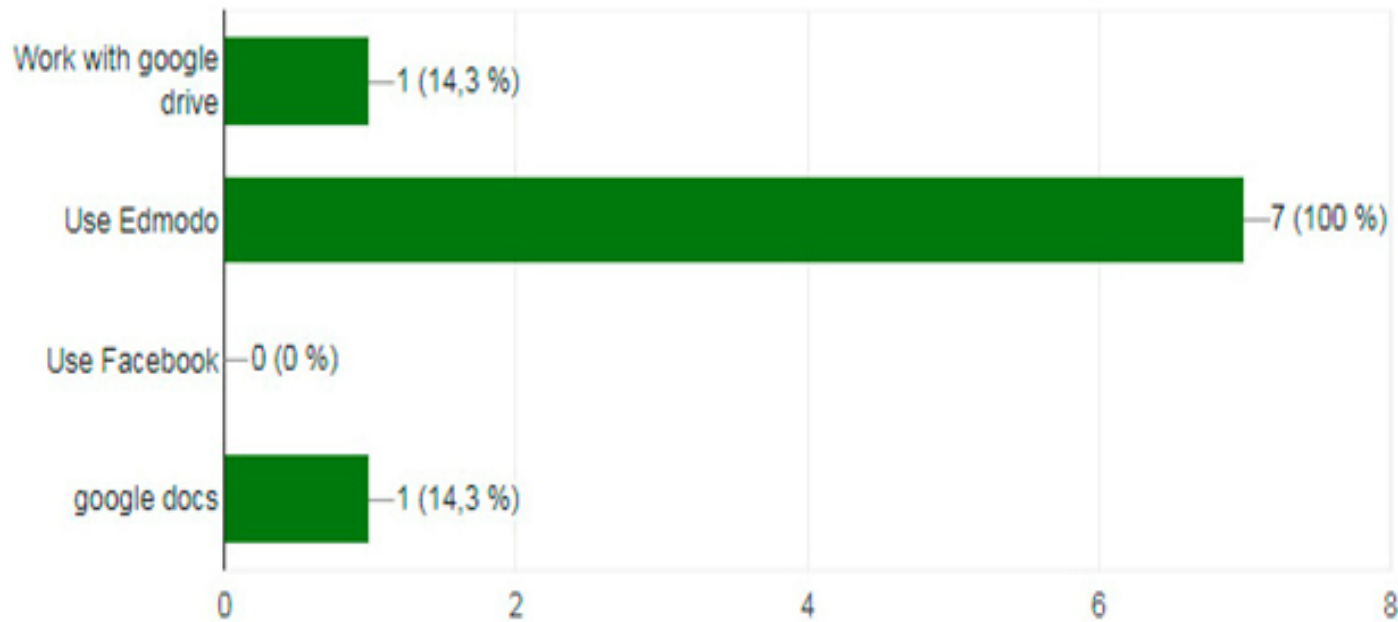
Which meeting have you participated in?



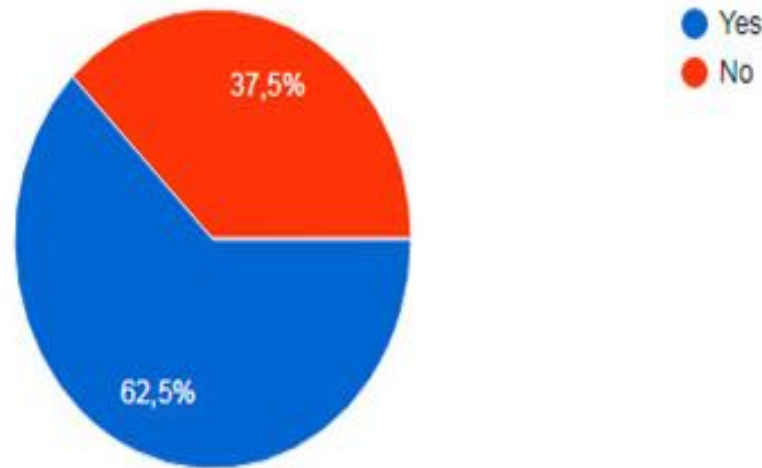
What did the project mean to you?

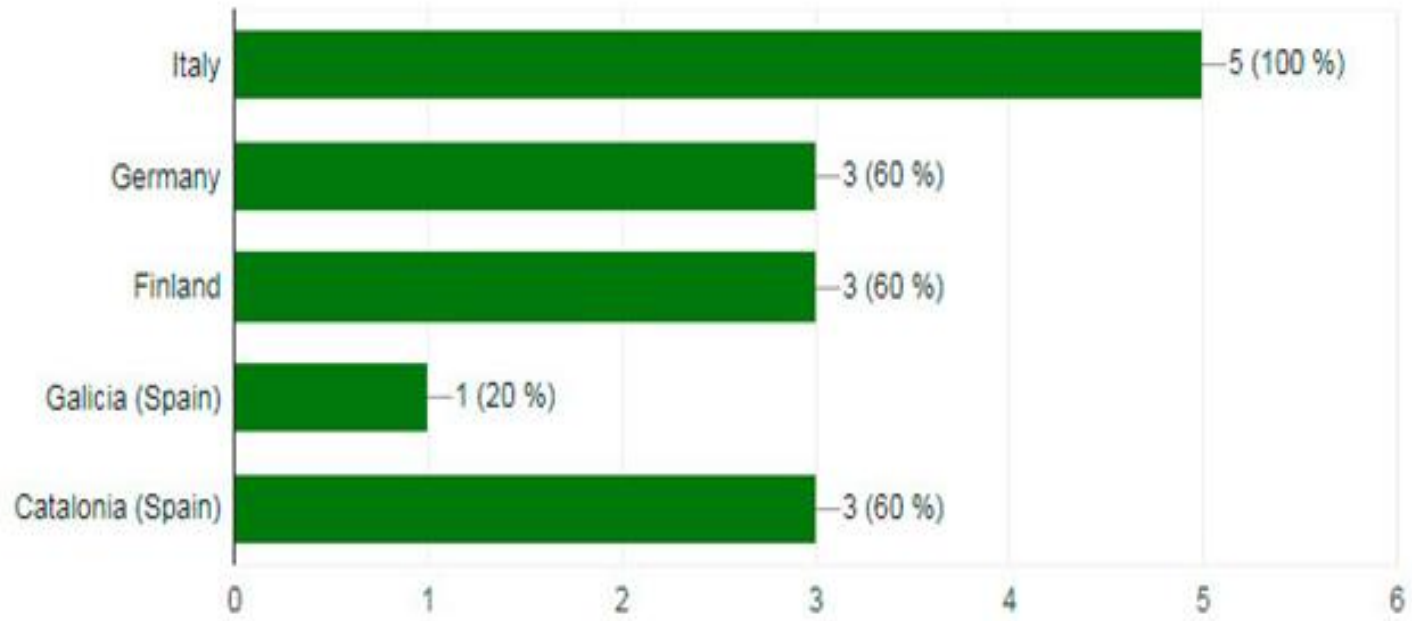
Which specific e-learnings have you acquired due to TN meetings or workshops that you attended?



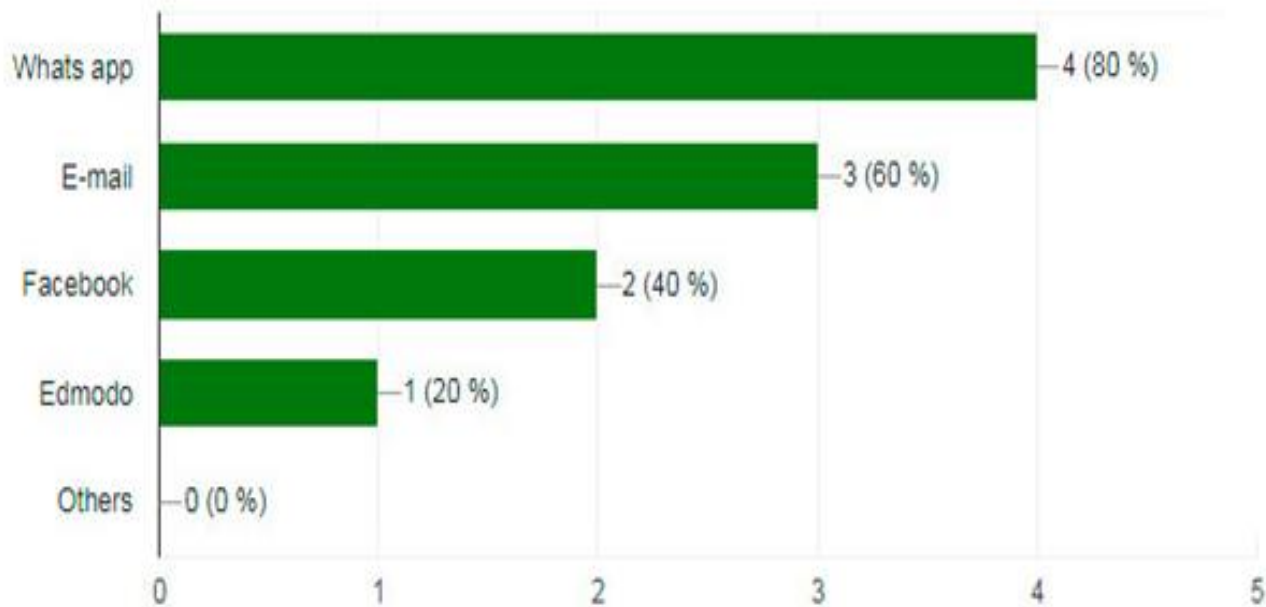
Are you keeping in touch with any of the colleagues from the other countries/ regions?



With which countries?

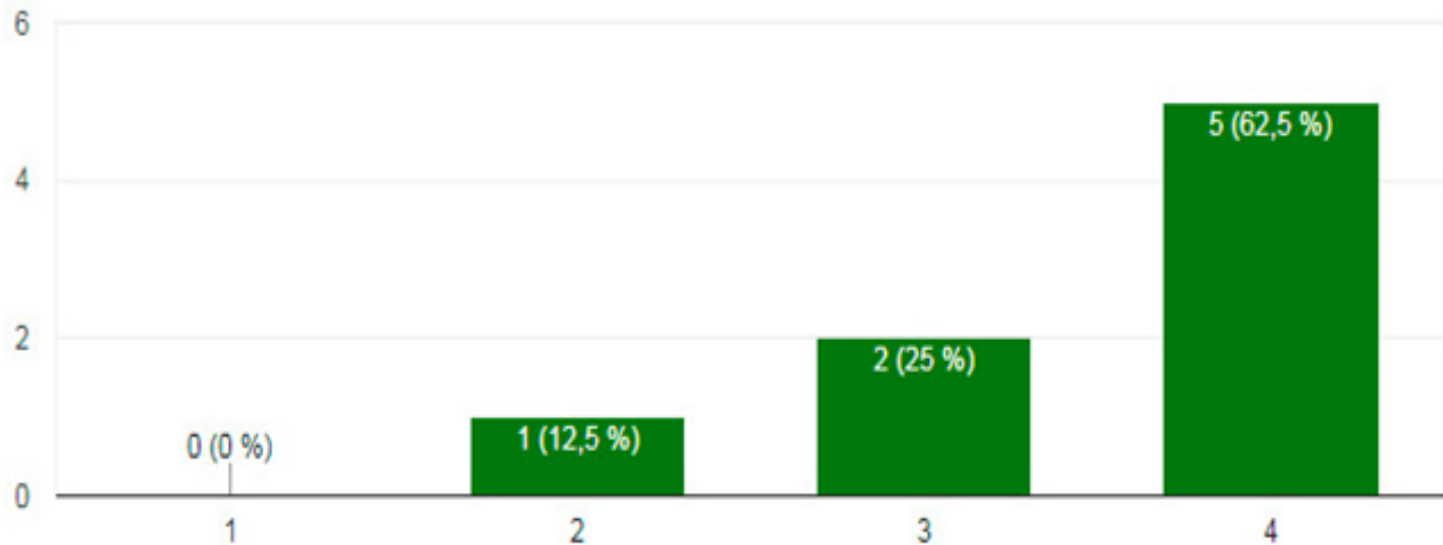


By which means?

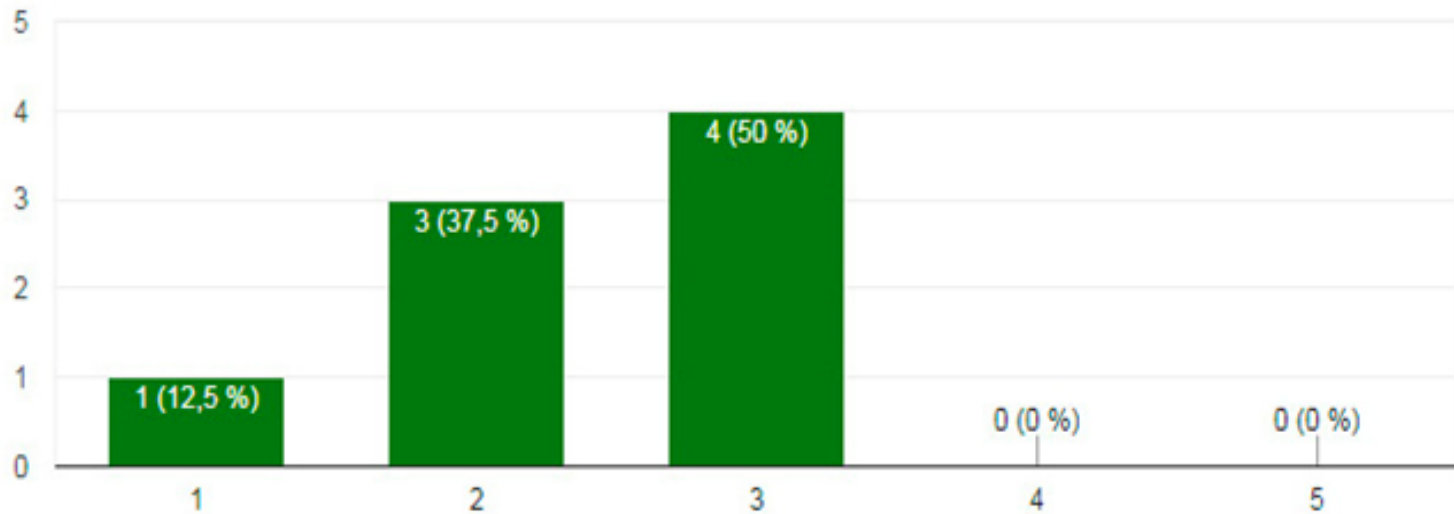

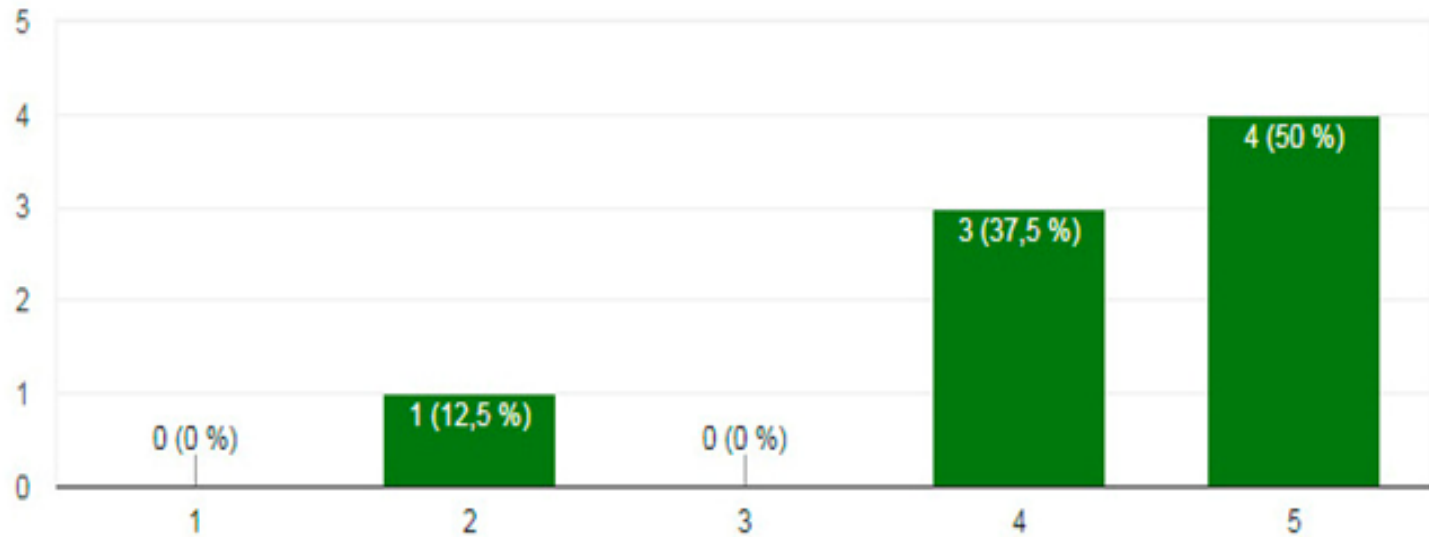
Grade your English level improvement.

(1 low 2 medium 3 high 4 very high)



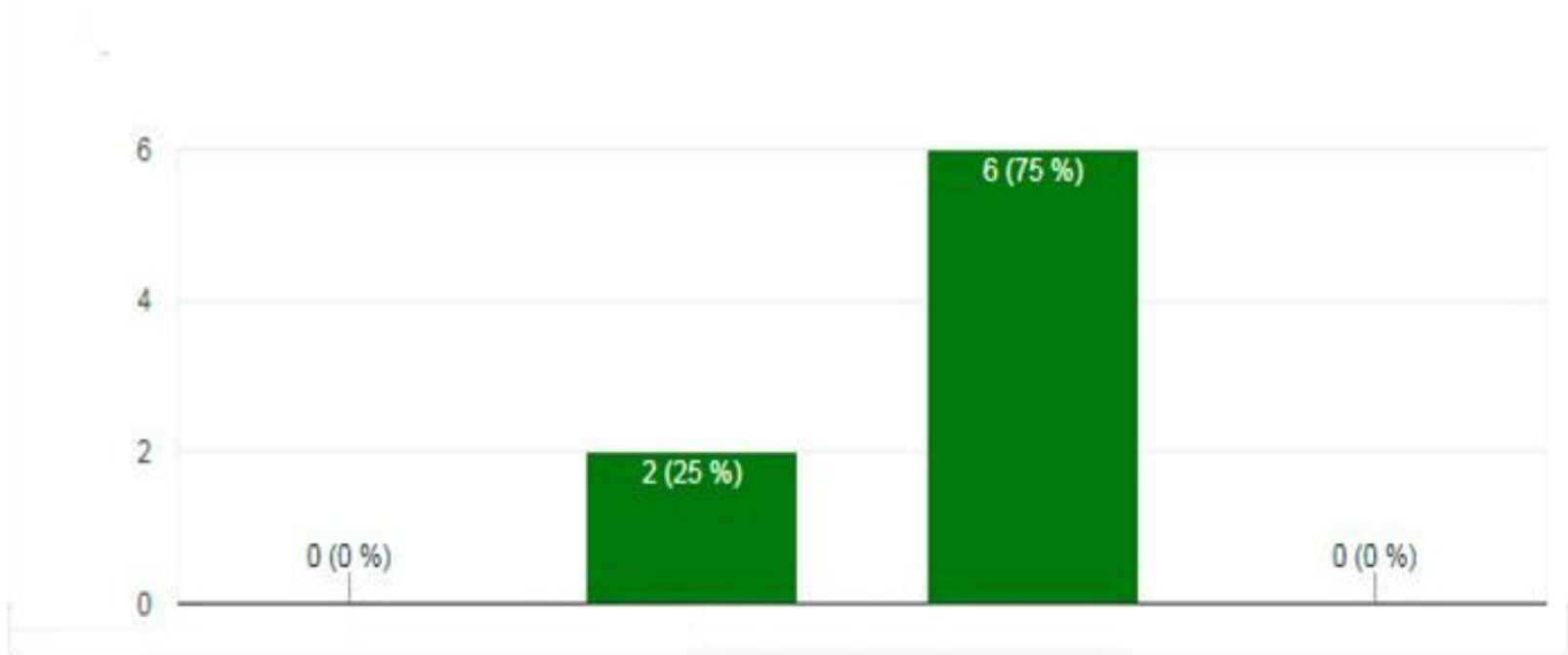

(1 equal 2 a bit 3 quite 4 very)



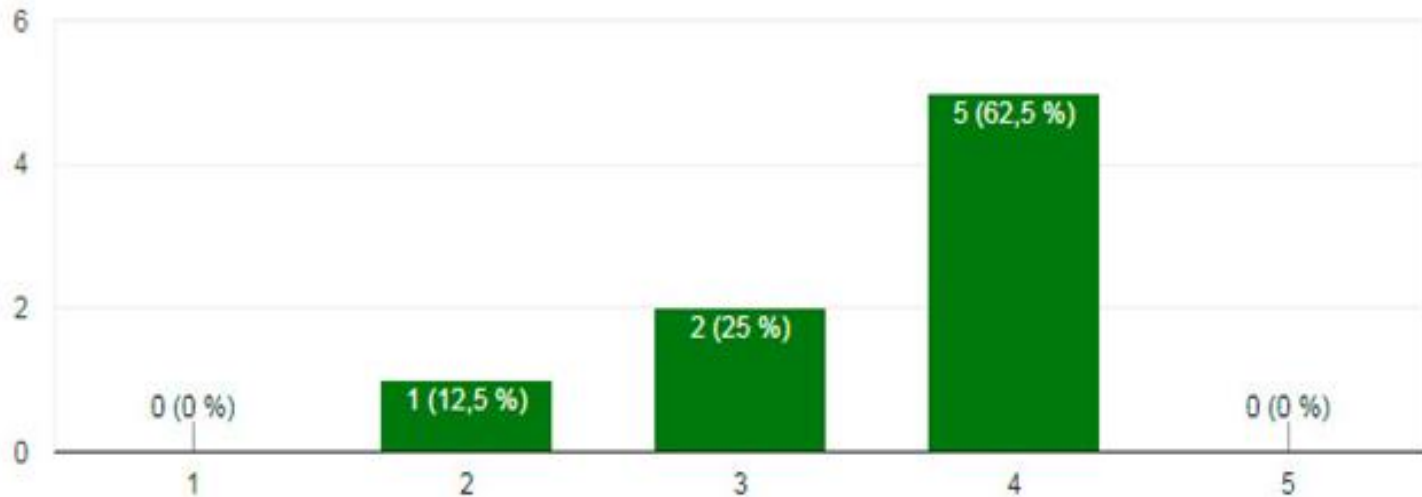
How useful for your classes are the workshops you attended ?

(1 low 2 medium 3 good 4 very good)



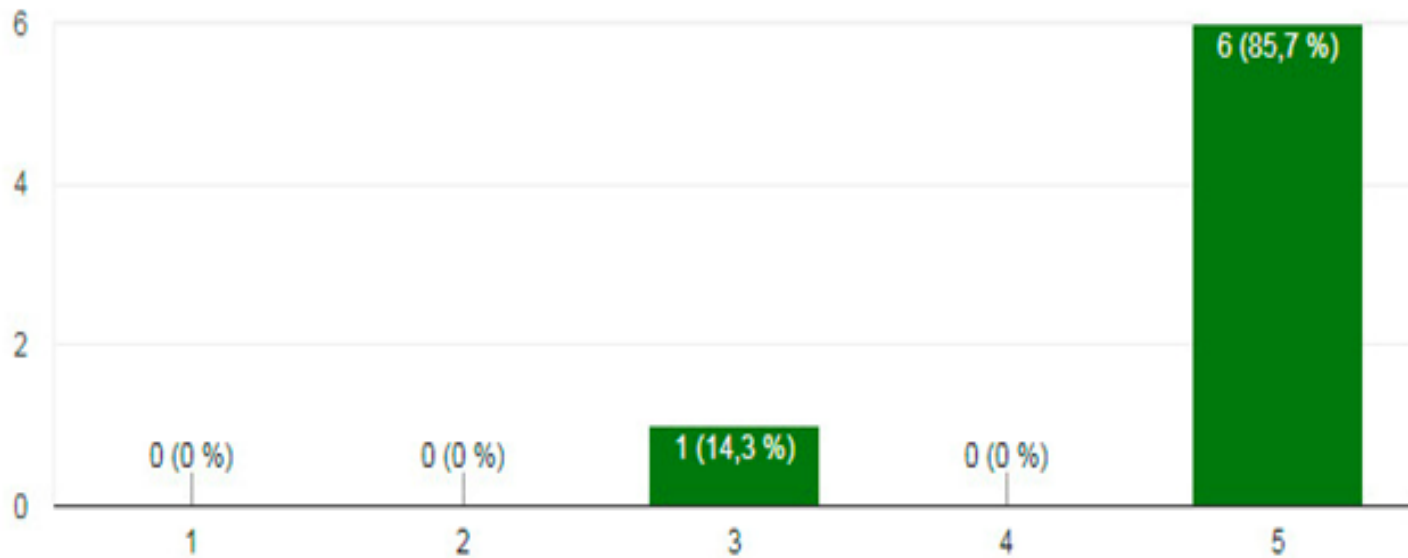

85,7% answers were positive or better: OK

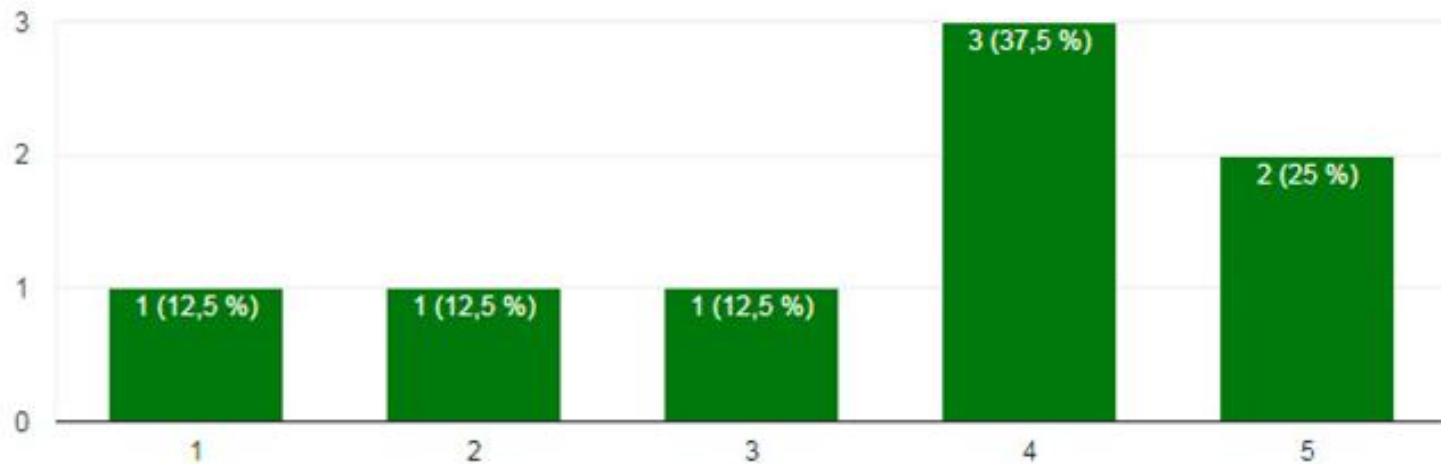
How were you welcomed by the local team, school, teachers staff, hotel (1 badly 2 average 3 well 4 very well)

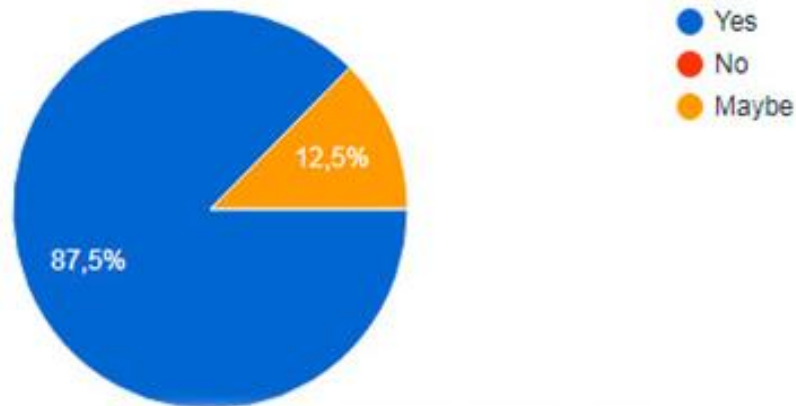
Have you acquired any skills for working in international educational programs after this experience?

(1 not 2 some 3 quite 4 a lot of)

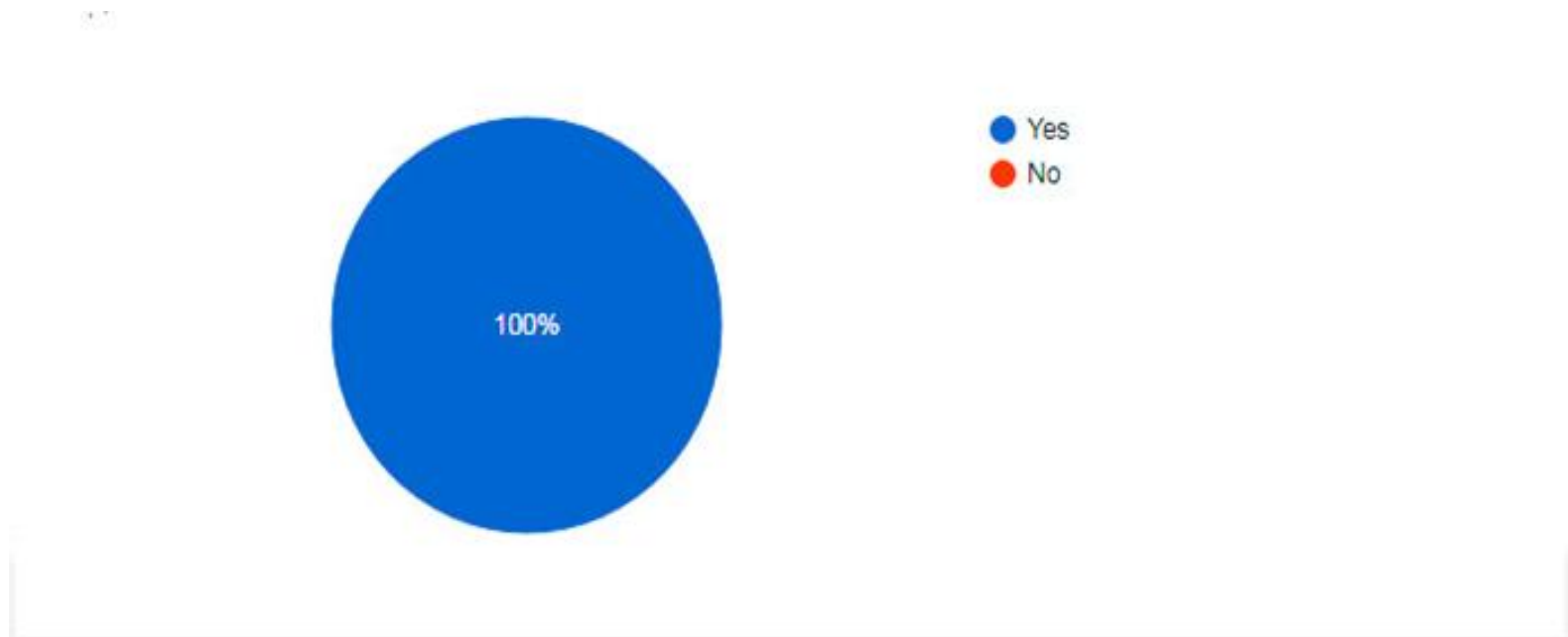
