KIMO1020 Multilingualism and language learning in a changing society – 5 ECTS

The course discusses phenomena that are related to language, language learning and teaching in contemporary society. The course orientates students to questions of language policy, multilingualism and societal change as well as to the role of language in the life of societies and individuals. The course conceptualizes language learning as activity which happens in interaction between individuals, communities and the society.

Aims

Upon completing the course, the student will

- understand language as a social and individual phenomenon
- be able to acknowledge the importance of languages in the construction of individual identities and social inclusion
- understand linguistic diversity and language as social action
- be able to distinguish between different concepts of language and language learning
- be familiar with the pedagogy of bilingual and multilingual early childhood education and teaching
- be able to apply their gained knowledge about the multilingualism of societies to the study of language learning and teaching

KIMO1010 Language Awareness and Multilingual Pedagogy – 5 ECTS

Aims

Upon completing the course, the student will

- understand multilingualism as a developing skill through lifelong learning
- be able to study language as part of thinking, socialization processes and interactional situations
- strengthen their understanding of the multivoicedness of language and culture
- be able to develop practices and activities that enhance participation in multilingual interaction
- be able to support the participation of different actors in community learning through cooperation with learners, teachers and parents / quardians
- be able to support learners in setting their goals of language learning
- know what support services are available in day care centres and schools, and will be able to build multi-professional cooperation with them within and outside of their institution

Optional but recommended course:

VAAM1350 Language, 5 ECTS

Aims

Upon completing the course, the student will

- be familiar with basic knowledge about child language development and linguistic awareness
- have gained skills to implement study modules in mother tongue, Finnish as a second language and foreign language in pre-school education
- be able to theoretically approach multiliteracies and apply theoretical knowledge in early childhood education
