GHANA-QUICK FACTS

- Ghana was the first country in sub-Saharan Africa to gain independence. It gained its independence on March 6, 1957.
- Ghana was ranked as Africa's most peaceful country by the Global Peace Index. (2016)
- The currency unit in Ghana is called the cedi.
- Ghana has a population of about 27.5 million.
- Ghana is divided into ten(10) regions each with an administrative capital.
- There are over 46 spoken languages in Ghana; the commonest are English and Akan (Twi).
- The traditional cloth of the Ghanaian people is the bright and colorful kente cloth. And smock. In the north, the men wear smock.
- Ghana has the largest market in West Africa. It's called Kejetia market and it's located in Kumasi, the Ashanti region's capital.
- Ghana is bounded by Côte d'Ivoire to the west, Burkina Faso to the north, Togo to the east, and the Atlantic Ocean to the south.
