- City gate of the Roman Empire
- Build in the first century
- Located in the city center
- Unique construction
- Today: visits possible, museum inside, many events located there

Porta Nigra as an cultural heritage

- UNESCO cultural heritage since 1986
- Fullfill criteria I,III, IV
 - Masterpiece of human creative genius
 - Bears a unique testimony to a cultural tradition/civilization which has dissapeard
 - Outstanding example of a type of building which illustrates a significant stage in human history
