
Setting the Agenda


Course teachers' greetings







AGENDA 2: Know Your Group



Group tasks for breakouts

1. Share an object (Introduction round)

a. Pick any one object from your room, backpack, pencil case ... and present it to the rest of your group. Tell your group how it represents you or what it makes you think about.

2. Exchange contact details for the presentation

- a. Discuss your known schedules for late January / early February (DL February 11)
- b. If you already set a date, reserve enough time (2 hours) and check the time difference using e.g. https://www.timeanddate.com/worldclock/meeting.html
- c. Make sure your entire group has everyone's email addresses, Whatsapp group or some way to contact one another
- d. Assign responsibility for checking in about the presentation scheduling

After that you are free to talk about your studies, interests, differences & similarities between IN & FI ... until breakout time is over.

Conclusion

If you had - or in the next steps of the task encounter - any trouble with your groups, contact your homegroup teacher! (sooner rather than later)

Your task requires you to create a presentation, but it is equally important to listen and follow up the other presentation with questions to clarify.
