- 4. It is one of the earliest American novels that focuses on women's issues.
- 5. It is also widely seen as a landmark work of early feminism.
- 6. It caused a mixed reaction from contemporary readers and critics.
- 7. The novel blends realistic narrative and social commentary.
- 8. The Awakening is a/the forerunner of American modernist literature.
- It echoes the works of her contemporaries such as Edith Wharton and Henry James.
- 10. It can also be considered among the first Southern works in a/the tradition that has been carried on to our day in the modern works of Faulkner and Tennessee Williams, for example.
