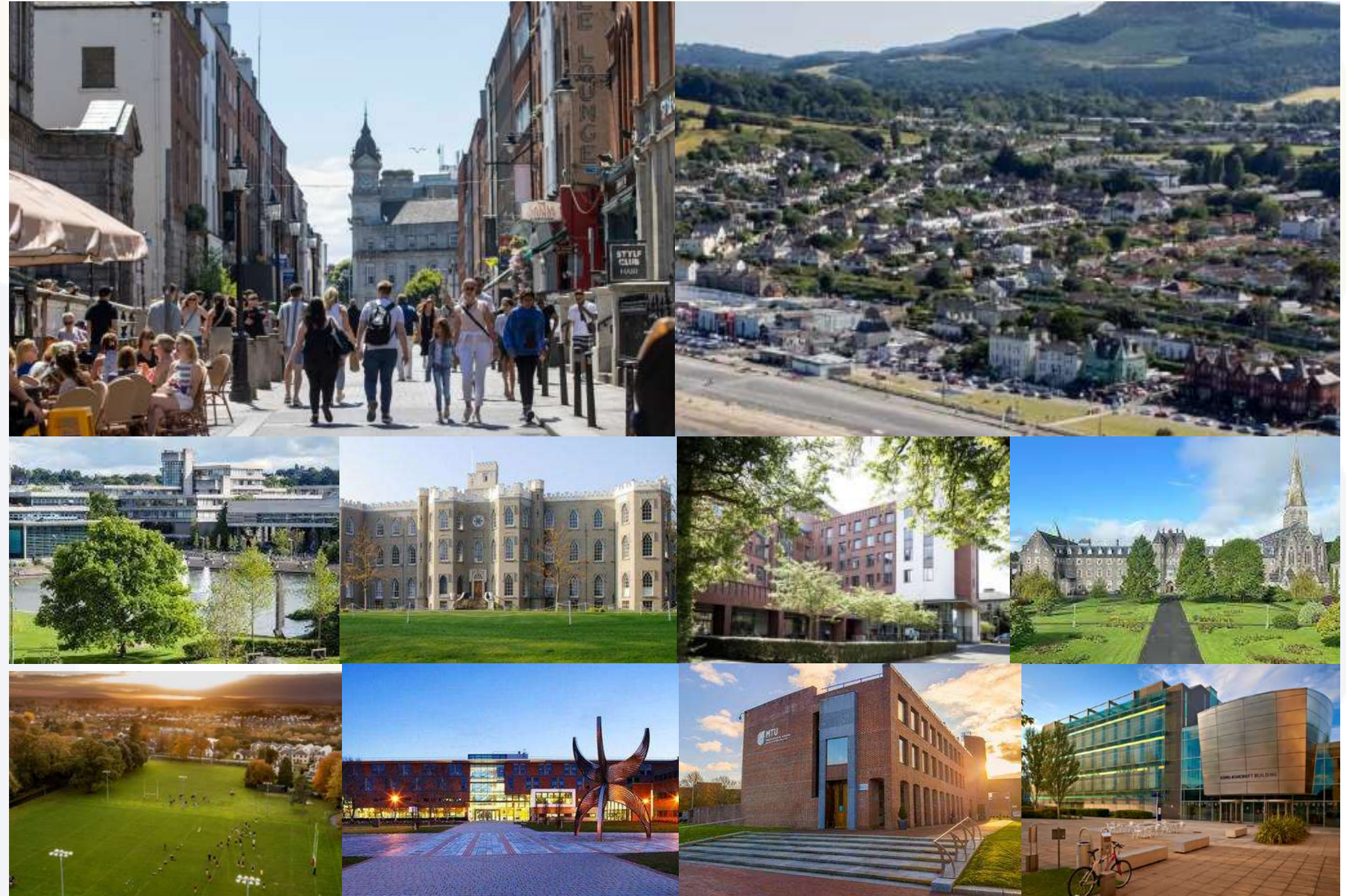

Create a Custom Text

- ✓ Tailor the text precisely to your students' needs.
- ✓ Control the difficulty level and the language features.
- ✓ Combine different objectives into one text.
- ✓ Integrate other skills and make a reading activity more active, communicative and collaborative.

Generate an engaging 500-word text about St. Patrick's Day for B2 16 year old English learners to develop comprehension skills. The text should cover the history of St. Patrick, key traditions, and modern celebrations. Make it informative but engaging for students. Include examples of the passive voice in various tenses - past simple passive, passive modals, present perfect passive etc.

"Divide this text into two parts with different missing information so students must ask each other questions to complete it (information gap)."

- ✓ Create an accurate transcript for any authentic audio
- ✓ Create targeted micro listening tasks such as gap fills, word spotting or reduced- form recognition

Hey, Sarah. Ready to dive in?

Act as a phonology/English language/pronunciation expert.
Analyse the audio at the link above (also attached), and the transcript (attached) to identify any features of speech in these two Irish speakers that will cause difficulty in understanding for B1-level learners, e.g., speakers using weak forms, examples of assimilation, contractions, etc., and accents.
Highlight these features in bold.

Create Micro Listening Activities from Transcripts

- ✓ Create an accurate transcript for any authentic audio
- ✓ Create targeted micro listening tasks such as gap fills, word spotting or reduced- form recognition

Hey, Sarah. Ready to dive in?

Create a decoding/micro-listening gap fill activity for students to notice and hear these weak forms.
Use one excerpt of the transcript with many examples of weak forms, not the whole transcript.

+

Generate a "spot the extra word" noticing exercise for students to notice words/sounds that are reduced or omitted.

Generate a "spot the wrong word" or "choose the right word" noticing exercise for students to develop bottom up processing decoding skills.
