THREE MONTHS IN FINLAND – Carla, Mar and Blai in Loimaa

Our high school gave us the possibility to spend 3 months in a foreign country (Finland) to improve our English level and to know a new educational system and a new culture. After a selection 3 of us were chosen (Blai, Mar and Carla) and left Igualada on August the 27th.

When we first arrived, everything was new for us, and very different to what we were used to see. We noticed that Finns are very closed people but pretty welcoming as well.
