The budget

- Elli's budget around 5 milloin euros
- Autonomous unit
- The city provides funding, but it is mainly based on state contributions)
 - includes absolutely everything (salaries, facilities)
 - the number of students has an effect: a high school student brings 7,500 euros a year to the city → high school



Finnish high schools



High schools in Finland

- 50% of the age group applies to high schools, 50% to vocational school
- In high school, you get prepared for university studies.
- All high schools are good in Finland: higheducated, motivated teachers!



High schools

- 3-4 y studies
- To study is free for Finnish students (incl. Laptop, books, lunch)
- Electronical matriculation exams

forssa Syllabus

- 1) is designed to last three years, but students may complete it in 3 to 4 years.
- 2) 150 credits are needed to receive a school-leaving certificate. Normally it takes three years.

Compulsory subjects

- 1) Mother Tongue (Finnish) 12 credits
- 2) English 12 credits



Compulsory subjects

- 1) Math 12-20 credits (general or advanced)
- 2) Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Geography, total 10 credits
- 3) History and social studies, philosophy etc. Total 26 credits
- 4) Music, art, P.E. 8 credits
- 5) Study councelling 4 credits

 TOTAL 94-102 (compulsary credits) +
 optional courses 56-48: sum 150 credits

Matriculation exams



National matriculation examination

- 1) Schooling ends with the national matriculation exams.
- 2) Mother tongue (=Finnish [own test for immigrants) is only compulsory test
- 3) Swedish, Math, Foreign language, general studies (humanities and natural sciences, e.g. Biology, history etc.): A student selects 4 tests.
- 4) Optional tests e.g. in languages. Students normally take part in 5-7 tests.



National matriculation examination: e-tests

- Tests to be taken electronically
- Good grades open doors to all universities in the world
