


Finnish High Schools – an overview



#### The Finnish curriculum

- The Finnish educational institution's curriculum has produced good results.
- In particular, Finnish schools produce young people who have the opportunity to live a happy and balanced life in a changing world.
- Teachers are **coaches** whose task is to support the student.



### Finnish high schools offer

- High-quality teaching and counselling
- Individual study paths



### Studies in Finnish High School

- 3-4 year studies
- To study is free (incl. laptop, e-books, lunch)



### Compulsory subjects

- Math 12-20 credits (general or advanced)
- 2) Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Geography, total 10 credits
- 3) History and social studies, philosophy etc. Total 26 credits
- 4) Music, art, P.E. 8 credits
- 5) Study councelling 4 credits

TOTAL 94-102 (compulsory credits) + optional courses 56-48: sum 150 credits



## Studies in Finnish High School


• Students get to choose the subjects and even teachers.




#### Study year

#### Five study periods

- School days from 8 to 16 (it varies a lot)
- 2 credits course: 3\*75 min in seven weeks
- 7 d test "weeks", one test / day




#### The city of Forssa

  - Two other subjects (e.g. Physics and Chemistry)








