The adult amateur orchestra "GIFt" consists of amateur musicians, music school students and teachers from Germany, Italy and Finland. The idea of "GIFt" came to life with the realization, that these three participating music schools all have an orchestra, that operates using this unique model, where amateur musicians play together with music school students and teachers. These kind of orchestras are relatively rare in Europe and the starting point of this project is the exchange of valuable information and good practices and the improvement and further development of the learning possibilities for adult amateur musicians. With the dissemination of the results we can bring this operating model to other music schools in Finland, Germany and Italy and to other European countries. With such an exciting project, we will hopefully be able to inspire many adult amateur musicians to join orchestras.

Music is a universal language and brings together people from different cultures, backgrounds and age groups. Playing an instrument has many positive effects on an individual and also on society. With adult amateur Orchestra "GIFt" we want to create an interesting possibility for adult amateur musicians to use and develop their instrumental skills and play concerts on a high artistic level.

Each country will bring to this project their expertise of their national music; this way the participants will learn about European cultural and musical heritage. This is also a great chance for the adult educators to share their information about andragogy (adult learning) and learn new practices. We will test new teaching methods nationally and transnationally. As a result the European collegility can develop so, that these new operating models become a permanent part of the music school portfolio with the help of digital media. We will create an international network of educators and adult amateur musicians, who will continue to learn from and support each other in the future.

We will organize one kick-off meeting in Finland in order to create a fuctioning operating model and to plan the details and practical arrangements of the project. The main goal will be the two transnational meetings, one in Germany and one in Finland. During these meetings the orchestras will rehearse intensively and the meetings will culminate in concerts held in the region. Each country will have 10 adult amateur musicians and 4 teachers, who take part in the transnational meetings. The two main conductors will come from Finland and



Germany. Every partner school will have their own area of responsibilities and all the responsibilities will be equally shared between the three partners.

Making music increases the human capital and the all-round wellbeing of a person; it elevates mental health, improves self-esteem and diminishes the effects of brain aging. Playing together improves social skills and strengthens sense of community. Getting to know and playing together with musicians from different countries will be a meaningful experience and will increase the solidarity between the participants and nations.

With this project we want to strengthen the orchestral culture in each region and spark joy in the people, who come to our concerts. "GIFt" is a gift not only for every amateur musician, educator and music school, but also for the whole society.

Background and Experience

lisalmen kansalaisopisto is a regional civic college a public funded educational institute that provides low cost liberal adult education. This means that lisalmen kansalaisopisto is a community college offering low cost open education to all members of the city. Almost 10 % of all the inhabitants living in the city take part yearly in at least one course organised by the college. Iisalmen kansalaisopisto gives yearly more than 11.000 hours of education mainly in languages, arts, sports and infomation technology.

The institute was established in 1961 and its actions are economically supported by the state and lisalmi city. In the organization of lisalmi, the civic college is part of the cultural sector. About 1800 adults are taking parts in the courses, eithe in on single or several different courses. Music studies are an essential part of the course tray of the school. It is possible to get both individual music lessons and take part in making music in groups, choirs and orchestras. All the genres of music are flexibly taught without boundaries.

Ylä-Savo sinfonietta is a common symphony orchestra of music school and civic college. The orchestra consists of both adult amateur players and music school students playing with professional musicians. The orchestra was founded in year 2015 and it offers two concert programs each year consisting of a rehearsal periods ending to public concerts held in lisalmi city and in the surroundings. The home of the orchestra is in the lisalmi Cultural center (https://www.iisalmi.fi/Suomeksi/Palvelut/Kulttuuri-ja-nuorisotyo/lisalmen-kulttuurikeskus) where the orchestra gives concerts in a 470-seat concert hall with nation-famous soloists. International co-operation has been an integral part of the activities of the college for many years. The international projects has been funded by lisalmen kansalaisopisto itself or by the own contribution of students. External funding has also been received from Erasmus+ program, from special grants of the Finnish National Board of Education and from private funds.



What are the activities and experience of the organisation in the areas relevant for this project? What are the skills and/or expertise of key persons involved in this project?

Due to the common headmaster and many common teachers working in both music school and civic college in lisalmi, lisalmen kansalaisopisto (Civic college) has a long history of international projects. Already during the years 2014 -2016 lisalmen kansalaisopisto took part in a Grundtvig project "Improviser pour apprendre, IMPRO +" with French, Latvian and Czech partners. Because the music education department in lisalmen kansalaisopisto works in close cooperation with Ylä-Savo music school with same headmaster and many music teachers, it is reasonable to describe a bit the international experience of the music school as well in this context. Ylä-Savo music school has been already twice the responsible coordinator of the Nordplus junior project with an Icelandic Music School for disabled children and a Latvian Music School in Lielvarde as partners. In 2016, the Northern Savonia Cultural Foundation awarded their Circle Award to the City of lisalmi thanks to the active international activities of the Music Institute and lisalmen kansalaisopisto. Upper Savo Music Institute has coordinated several international projects funded by the National Board of Education, including a "Solo Orchestra" project. This project included orchestral visit to Hungary in cooperation with eight other music schools in Eastern Finland. The "International Chamber Music" project took young players from the music school to perform in France. A major international concert project, related to the anniversary of Finland's independence, was performed in 2017 by a huge international symphony orchestra and choir on stage. The latest international project so far has been the "Composing in Europe!" project, where our teachers and students were improvising and composing together with students from our cooperation schools in Latvia, Hungary and Estonia.

The headmaster of lisalmen kansalaisopisto (Civic college) has an extensive experience in international affairs both at the lisalmi Civic College at the Music school, whose he is also the rector. In addition to this, he works also as a town twinning manager in the city of lisalmi and as a spokesperson for the Erasmus + / Nordplus adult education programs appointed by the National Board of Education. In December 2017, the headmaster of lisalmen kansalaisopisto was awarded the lisalmi City Award for his active work in the area of internationalisation. Most of the music teachers working at the civic college have international experience from various projects at the music school. Some teachers have been involved specifically in the Erasmus + adult education project related to improvisation. Two teachers just lately completed their higher university degrees in improvisation and in the diversification of music theory teaching.

Rauno Tikkanen, the conductor of Ylä-Savo Sinfonietta, has made a long career as a musician, conductor and teacher. Nowadays he is responsible of orchestra and chamber music education as well as conducting, clarinet playing and improvisation teaching in Savonia University of Applied Sciences.

He has studied conducting with legendary professor Jorma Panula, among others. Rauno Tikkanen has conducted for example Utah Philharmonic (USA), II Maestri (England), Vanemuise Symphony Orchestra and Pärnu Philharmonic (Estonia), Brasov Philharmonic (Romania) among many Finnish orchestras. Together with Marjo Suhonen, violin teacher of Ylä-Savo Music Institute, they founded Ylä-Savo Sinfonietta, which has developed in few years to a high quality amateur orchestra. Marjo Suhonen takes care of orchestra´s period planning and she is also responsible of coaching the string players of the orchestra. For this work she makes use of her backround as a violin player in several professional orchestras and also experience as a producer on international music festivals held in Finland and Scandinavia.

Background and Experience

Founded by Piero Farulli in 1974, the Scuola di Musica di Fiesole is among the most famous of Italian music schools. It offers several different formative educational courses including a music kindergarten, pre-academic music school, bachelor, master and post-graduate courses with annual masterclasses with major artists from around the world. The Scuola di Musica di Fiesole is also the home of the European String Quartet Academy, the Orchestra Giovanile Italiana, and has active collaborations with other world class universities and conservatories of music, including the Conservatory "G. Verdi" of Torino, Universität für Musik und darstellende Kunst Wien, Norwegian Academy of Music, Royal Conservatory The Hague, Lithuanian Academy of Music and Theatre, Royal Northern College of Music, Conservatorie National Supérieur de Musique et de Danse de Paris among many others.

The School's awards include the First Annual Abbiati Prize in 1981 for being the "finest musical initiative", the President of the Republic National Award from President Carlo Azeglio Ciampi in 2005 and the Praemium Imperiale Grant for Young Artists from the Japan Art Association in 2008. Students at the Scuola di Musica di Fiesole have the unique opportunity to embrace and experience this culture first-hand by studying with internationally respected and renown professors, keepers of the Italian and western musical traditions, by visiting some of the world's finest collections of paintings, statues and frescoes in numerous museums throughout the city, as well as being able to attend concerts held by excellent ensembles such as the Orchestra del Maggio Musicale Fiorentino, the Orchestra da Camera Fiorentina and the Orchestra della Toscana, among others.

Upon completion of a degree program at the Scuola di Musica di Fiesole, graduates will be well prepared to carry on the torch of our common cultural heritage. They will be ready to enter into their desired professional musical setting with an enhanced world-view and appreciation of the performing arts and an acute sense of artistic expression paired with technical refinement.

The City of Fiesole is located in the foothills that surround Florence and was founded around the 9th-8th century BCE by the Etruscan civilization. It has been continually inhabited ever since, controlled by the Roman civilization, the Florentine Republic and ultimately the Italian Republic. The Scuola di Musica di Fiesole is located in a 16th century Villa, easily accessible by public transportation, 6km from Florence's Duomo cathedral and historic city center. According to Piero Farulli's idea that "Music is an asset to be shared", another important project involves the top groups who will be asked to hold lessons for young ensembles of the school in order to share with them the knowledge they have gained. In the coming years small chamber music groups of the Sistema delle Orchestre e dei Cori Giovanili e Infantili (Network of Youth and Children's Orchestras and Choirs), founded in Italy according to the model of M° Abreu Venezuelan orchestras, will be involved.



What are the activities and experience of the organisation in the areas relevant for this project? What are the skills and/or expertise of key persons involved in this project? Please explain how the organisation brings an essential added value to the project.

The Scuola di Musica di Fiesole has a long and storied experience in chamber music and orchestra. These two disciplines are fundamental in the process of learning music and are obligatory courses for all students in the pre-academic and academic programs of study within the School. From the very beginning, students at the Scuola di Musica di Fiesole are involved in chamber music groups and in the various orchestras within the school. There are effectively 7 orchestras, from first-year novice students in violin, cello, piano and contrabass (Micromusici), graduating to a group in the second year that integrates harp students (Piccolissimi Musici), graduating to the other orchestras according to the students' age group and proficiencies (Crescendo, Orchestra dei ragazzi, Orchestra Galilei), and arriving at the 'Orchestra Giovanile Italiana', the Italian Youth Orchestra, one of the most productive and prolific group educational projects at the school. Scuola di Musica di Fiesole has a long experience in teaching adult learners by letting them play in orchestras and ensembles together with professional teachers and younger music school students.

The primary pedagogical goal is to stimulate the students through group musical experiences, given that collective lessons increment the motivation and desire to continue learning. The school has activated a completely free educational experience with the possibility to learn in a multi-ethnic environment in a peripheral area of Florence, constituting one of the nuclei of the Italian System of Youth Orchestras and Choirs; furthermore from Fiesole – in collaboration with the Florentine Ateneo – a First-level Masters postgraduate course was conceived, seeking to create more operators in this sector.

From these experiences, a new didactic method was born in which each participating instrumental student shares music lessons with other students and involves them in chamber music ensembles and orchestra.

The Scuola di Musica di Fiesole is also the headquarters of the ECMA, the European Chamber Music Association, founded in 2002 with the intent to favor the knowledge of roots and common cultural qualities from European musical repertoire, respecting and following the existing and diverse cultures within the European Union. For this reason, four professors were chosen to be founding members and tutors of the Association, representing diverse geo-political European historic points of reference: Hatto Bayerle of the Alban Berg Quartet and Norbert Brainin of the Amadeus Quartet, heirs of the Viennese and Central European tradition, Milan Skampa of the Smetana Quartet – esteemed expert in Slavic culture – and Piero Farulli of the Italian Quartet, representative of the Mediterranean cultural world.

As a member of ECMA, the Scuola di Musica di Fiesole has recently participated in an Erasmus+ European project entitled ECMA Next Step, that terminated on 31 August 2018 and saw the Norwegian Academy of Music of Oslo (Norway) as the lead Organization of the project.

Background and Experience

Jugendmusikschule Württembergisches Allgäu (JMS) is a music institute, that offers music education for children, adolescents and adults. The school was established in year 1967 and carries a long tradition in educating fine young musicians in southern Germany. At the time the school has approximately 2100 students and 60 teachers. The music school offers education to all age groups, beginning from early childhood music education, going on to instrumental education, preparation for university studies, choirs, ensemble education and orchestral playing. One of the main pedagogical and artistic values of the school is playing and learning together. The school has 6 orchestras for the music school students in different agegroups levels and is also responsible for the pedagogical amateur Orchestra, Städteorchester Württembergisches Allgäu, which will take part in this project. The musical ensembles of the school, with nearly 200 concerts in year, are a central componet of the musical and cultural life in the region. The cooperation with the regional amateur wind orchestras, schools and kindergardens and the exchange projects and professional developments show the vitality of the music school.

The orchestra participating in this project, Städteorchester Württembergisches Allgäu, was founded in 1973 and has about 50 to 60 members between the ages of 16 and 80 years and consist 60% of amateur musicians, 20% of music students and 20% of teachers and other professional musicians. The orchestra organises three symphony concerts in cities of Wangen, Leutkirch and Isny twice a year. The amateur sting players rehearse regurarly once a week throughout the year and the wind players join the rehearsals in the middle of the project. The orchestra has a strong pedagogical aspect, as the music school teachers play with and lead each instrumental group. This way the amateurs and music school students get to learn and play with professionals on a high artistic level.

What are the activities and experience of the organisation in the areas relevant for this project? What are the skills and/or expertise of key persons involved in this project? Please explain how the organisation brings an essential added value to the project.

Jugendmusikschule Württembergisches Allgäu organizes every year well over 100 concerts. In its 52-year history, the orchestral work has been an important part of the schools portfolio. Because of this, the school has a wide experience in this field. The music school has string- and wind-orchestras for three different age groups beginning with children the age of 8 to 12 years and culminating to symphonic wind-orchestra and symphony orchestra. The orchestra participating in this project, Städteorchester Württembergisches Allgäu, was founded in 1973 and looks back on a long tradition of orchestral work. The orchestra consists of music school students, instrumental teachers and adult amateur musicians. The orchestra has over 40 years of experience in this unique field, where professional musicians play together with amateurs.

Right from the beginning, the music school has been a flag-bearer for the idea, that music connects people and nations. The music school has longstanding connections with other schools and institutes in eastern Europe, Italy, France and even Finland. Since many years they have been committed in uniting people from different nations with music.

The key persons involved in this project are:

- Marcus Hartmann is the artistic director and principal conductor of Städteorchester Württembergisches Allgäu since 2015. He studied violin in "Mozarteum" in Salzburg, Austria. He is responsible for the planning of the concert programs and obtaining and putting together the musical scores for the orchestra. Every year the orchestra plays 3 concerts in the spring saison and 3 concerts in the autumn saison. Hartmann is the principal conductor for one concert saison every year, and for the other saison the orchestra invites a guest conductor, who takes over the rehearsals at the final phase before the concerts. In these concerts Marcus Hartmann plays in the orchestra as leader of the viola section or the 2. violin. He is the leader and conductor of two other orchestras of the music school with students in different age groups. In addition he is the conductor of 2 amateur orchestras in the region. In 2019 he won the 3. prize at an international conducting competition in Budapest. He is involved in all fields of this project from the very beginning.

- Dr. Hans Wagner is the director of Jugendmusikschule Württembergisches Allgäu and sits on the board of the Städteorchester Württembergisches Allgäu.

- Anni Poikonen is a pianist, piano teacher and head of the pianofaculty in the music school. She is responsible for coordinating and planning this Erasmus + project.

In this project we present a unique orchestra model, where adult amateur musicians play together with professionals and music school students on a high artistic level. By combining the forces of three such orchestras internationally, we will be able to further develop each orchestra and create a functioning and sustainable model for the future. This model will be shared to be used by other music education centers nationally and in Europe.

With this project we bring together teachers from three music institutes with different background and experience in adult education. They will have the possibility to exchange information and learn new practices from each other. That will extend and develop the competences of these educators and also improve the adult education in every partner school.

The concerts will include music from all three countries. This way the musicians will be able to learn and exchange valuable information about the musical and cultural heritage of each country. This will increase the understanding and feeling of togetherness between these people.

Project Description

Please explain the context and the objectives of your project as well as the needs and target groups to be addressed. Why should this project be carried out transnationally?

The aim of this project is to put together a symphony orchestra consisting mainly of adult amateur musicians from three different countries; Finland, Germany and Italy. It will be an intercultural and intergenerational orchestra that brings together people from different musical backgrounds. The orchestra will consist 60% of amateur musicians, 20% of music school students and 20% of teachers and other professionals.

The target group of this project is adult amateur musicians. People usually start learning an instrument at a young age and most of them continue until adulthood. After that they rarely have an opportunity to continue with this valuable hobby and to use their instrumental skills. Being able to play in a symphony orchestra will give them motivation and a goal for their practicing. With this model, where the amateurs play together with professionals, they also have the opportunity to develop their instrumental skills, learn from the professionals and play concerts on a high artistic level. Working together in a group will impact the learning in a positive way; it improves attention, involvement and the acquisition of knowledge.

Each partner school already has an orchestra that functions using this unique model. In Finland Ylä-Savo Sinfonietta, in Germany Städteorchester Württembergisches Allgäu and in Italy Amateur Music Ensemble (ÂME) This concept is quite rare in all these countries and this project should be carried out transnationally, so that the orchestras have the exceptional possibility to exchange valuable practices, learn from each other and further develop the model in each country. The amateur musicians will be able to share their own musical and cultural traditions and learn from the traditions of the other two countries. This will strengthen the sense of community between these people from three different European nations.

The aim is to carry out one transnational kick-off meeting in Finland and transnational orchestra meetings, one held in Finland, one in Germany. Each meeting consists of a rehearsal period for the orchestra, followed by concerts in the region. In every meeting the orchestra will be the size of a regular symphony orchestra (50-65 musicians) and will consist 60% of the musicians from the host country and 40% of the visitors from the two other participating countries.

Each musician, who takes part in a transnational meeting, will prepare intensively for the projects. Each partner will prepare a study package for the participating amateurs. They will take instrumental lessons from teachers of the music institutes, refresh their language skills and get acquainted with the cultural and musical heritage of each country before each transnational meeting.

Each country will also send a small group of music school students to the transnational meetings with the help of local funding. This will broaden the age structure of this orchestra and the students will experience how they can continue with their hobby also in adulthood. This project benefits not only the participants of the transnational meetings, but also all the musicians, who play in these local orchestras, as they get to play with other amateur musicians and two conductors from different countries.



What results are expected during the project and on its completion?

This project will improve the hobby possibilities for adult amateur musicians. Although we are going to offer amateur musicians memorable experiences by organizing six great concerts with transnational orchestra members and leaders, the main goal is to develop an educational system for amateur musicians especially in orchestra playing. In this concept we test new ways to improve the skills of amateur musicians by creating interesting ways to teach by utilizing the knowledge of the teachers from the participating countries. Teachers will share their knowledge before the meetings with video- / online-lessons; for example Italians will teach pronouncing of music vocabulary (Italy is the main language in classical music) or Finnish teachers can explain how to phrase Finnish music (like Sibelius what we're going to play in concerts); these are examples what we find that local teachers are not able to teach at least very authentically without help of native colleagues.

For adult amateur players this project offers:

- Possibility to develop themselves in many ways: Orchestra playing in this project gives great opportunity to develop also social communication, language skills etc. within their important hobby.

- A goal for the hobby: concerts abroad motivate to practice even more than before and the players will get more commited to their hobby.

- Interesting learning environment with different leaders / conductors.

- Possibility to meet other amateur players. For example in the Finnish orchestra there is only one viola player, who doesn't know any other amateur violists. In this project orchestra players will meet other people who have exactly the same hobby.

- Possibility to understand different music cultures better and more deeply.

- Feedback and development ideas of instrumental skills from leaders and other players.

- Project establishes the fellowship between Europeans, as people get this possibility to share the concert experience. Among the trips people will learn a lot of the cultural heritage of other countries.

- Working together in a group will have a positive impact on learning. Studies show that working in a group improves attention, involvement and acquisition of knowledge by learners.

For teachers this project offers the possibility to:

- Improve their adult pedagogy skills.
- Improve their knowledge of orchestra music / professional field.
- Share good practices and tips with other teachers.
- Build a transnational contact-Network, from which they benefit also after this project.
- Become better aware of European music culture and adult education systems and methods in music.

The benefits for the music schools taking part in this project:

- Possibility to test interesting new learning methods for adult learners.
- Increasing the amount of adult learners in music school and orchestras.
- Supplying goal-directed hobby possibilities for adults.

- Presenting the music school students a platform, where they can continue to learn as adults. This gives the hobby more purpose and a goal.

As a result we get an evolved model for a community orchestra, from which the whole environment will benefit.



In what way is the project innovative and/or complementary to other projects already carried out by the participating organisations?

For most of the adult amateurs this will be the first opportunity to take part in such project and play with adult amateur musicians from other countries. The participating orchestras have rarely or never had the possibility to take part in a transnational meeting. The music schools often organize exchange projects for their students, but a project for adult amateurs is rare or nonexistent.

A new experience for the participants will be a "study package", which each institute will create individually for them. With this this package they will prepare intensively for the transnational meetings. The 10-hour package will include instrumental lessons, the participants will refresh their language skills and learn new languages, they will learn about the customs, culture and musical heritage of the other participating countries.

The coronavirus pandemic has forced the music institutes to learn to use digital media to ensure that their lessons can continue. Finland is quite advanced in using digital media to support learning and especially Germany can learn a lot from them through this project. These digital media skills will be put in use in this project. In preparation of the transnational meetings, the teachers and conductors will create instructional videos and tutorials that will help the orchestras to prepare for the transnational meetings. Through the network of adult amateur musicians, teachers and conductors, that we will create with this project, we will be able to support each other also in the future with the help of digital media.

The teachers of the music schools mostly have children and youngsters as students and adult education can be a new field for them. In the beginning of this project we will organise a video lecture about andragogy (adult learning) in music, which will be held for all the participating teachers by en expert on this special field.

How did you choose the project partners and what will they bring to the project? Does it involve organisations that have never previously been involved in a Strategic Partnerships project?

These three organisations came together because all the music schools have an orchestra that operates using this unique model in which the adult amateurs, music school students, teachers and other professionals play together. The music school in lisalmi has already had some cooperation with both music institutions. Marjo Suhonen from Ylä-Savo Sinfonietta, has visited both schools and orchestras in Italy and Germany. Mr. Riccardo Cecchetti, the contact person in Italy, has visited lisalmi and the Finnish music school students have taken part to the Virtuoso & Belcanto Festival in Lucca, from which he is the artistic director. Anni Poikonen, the contact person in Germany, was born in lisalmi and has a close connection with the music school there.

Each one of the partners brings its own expertise to the project. The orchestra in Germany was founded in year 1973 and has a long history and traditions. The younger orchestras can benefit and learn from this experience. On the other hand the younger orchestras bring new innovative ideas, from which the german orchestra can learn. The music school in Germany is famous for its high quality education of percussionists and wind players. This is due to the fact, that southern Germany has a strong and outstanding wind orchestra - culture. The chambers music and string education in Italy is exquisite and the other partners will benefit hugely from their knowledge. Finland on the other hand is advanced in using digital media and this will come in handy, as we aim to utilise the means of digital media in this project.

The music school in Germany has never been involved in a Strategic Partnership project, but the schools in Italy and Finland have a lot of experience in this field.



How will the tasks and responsibilities be distributed among the partners?

The starting point of planning and making the GIFt project has been clear to all partners from the beginning: The success of the projet relies heavily on the equal involvement of each partner Institution.

The tasks and responsibilities in the project will be distributed in the following way:

The Project Management, including the relevant coordinative activities, financial management and risk analysis will be the responsibility of lisalmen kansalaisopisto.

- Iisalmi and Wangen will organise the Learning Events in their countries.
- The Communication Plan and Dissemination of the results will be guided by lisalmen kansalaisopisto with help of the other partners.

- The Monitoring and Evaluation Plan will be created and implemented by Jugendmusikschule Württembergisches Allgäu. The plan consists of observations, collection of materials, analysis and use of data and information in order to guarantee a satisfactory way of reaching the goals set and to enact eventual preventative and/or corrective actions.

- Italy has suffered severely from the coronavirus and for that reason Fondazione Scuola Di Musica Di Fiesole cannot commit to taking huge organisational responsibilities at the moment. However because of their European known experience in orchestra, ensemble and string pedagogy combining music school students, professional musicians and adult amateurs musicians, Italy is ready to take the lead in the pedacogical management of the project.

If relevant, please identify and explain the involvement of associated partners, not formally participating in the project. Please explain how they will contribute to the implementation of specific project tasks/activities or support the dissemination and sustainability of the project.

In order to maximise dissemination activities and impact, the project GiFt can count on the support of National music school associations in Italy, Germany and Finland (please see letters of support attached).

These associations are:

1. AIDSM – Associazione italiana delle Scuole di Musica (http://www.aidsm.it/), which count 50 members, 12.000 pupils in music and art schools, 1.500 teachers;

2. Der Landesmusikrat Baden-Württemberg (http:// Imr-bw.de /) is an umbrella organisation for music institutions in Baden-Württemberg, represents 1,6 million members, brings together different musical and educational networks.

3. SML- Suomen musiikkippilaitosten liitto, the Association of Finnish Music Schools

(http://www.musicedu.fi/), that involves 90 municipalities, 60.000 pupils in music schools and 3.500 teachers.

Moreover, through AIDSM - Associazione italiana delle Scuole di Musica,

the project has the support of Onda Latina, the Latin permanent working group of EMU - European Music School Union, whose members are France, Italy, Spain, Luxembourg, Belgium and Switzerland.

All these National and international associations are members of EMU - European Music School Union (https://www.musicschoolunion.eu/). The EMU is the European umbrella organisation of national music school associations in Europe. It is a non-governmental and a non-profit organisation and represents a supranational platform comprised of member associations from various countries of the European Union. At present, national music school associations from 25 European countries are members of the EMU. Thus, the EMU represents more than 6.000 music schools, 150.000 teaching staff, 4.000.000 pupils/students.

Thanks to this European-wide network, the project . will have the possibility to disseminate and transfer its results to a large number of adult education centers, music schools and other organisations providing orchestra playing for adults.



Participants

Please briefly describe how you will select and involve participants in the different activities of your project.

The participants in this project are adult amateur music students who play in the orchestras of each school at the moment. The main orchestra teachers in each participating institution will also take part in the mobilities.

Ten adult amateurs and four teachers will participate from each country. The selection will be done by the board of teachers in each country according to the applications of the students. The criteria of the selection will be openly published before the selection. The participants will be chosen among the adult amateur musicians playing instruments needed in the project and having sufficient potential to meet successfully the instrumental and social qualifications to play in a high level international orchestra. Each chosen student will get a study package of minimal ten hours contact teaching to get prepared for the orchestra periods. In addition to that the participating adult learners will be provided by study material like instructive pedagogic videoclips produced by participating teachers. The production of these videos will happen under the guidance of Fondazione

Scuola Di Musica Di Fiesole.

Preparation

Please describe what will be done in preparation by your organisation/group and by your partners/group before the actual project activities take place, e.g. administrative arrangements, communication about the activities, selection of the persons, coaches, involvement of stakeholders, etc.

The program for the concerts in the transnational meetings will be sought out together in cooperation between the partners. The program will include music from each country. The conductors, together with teachers, will make preparations for the musical piece that comes from their country. They will prepare the musical scores, make the right fingerings and bowings. They will actively stay in contact with the conductor and teachers from the other participating countries and exchange and discuss musical aspirations and ideas for the pieces. The conductors and teachers will also make instructional videos from their piece for the other orchestras, so that the preparations run smoothly and effectively. Each country will plan the study package for their participants.

The leading teachers and conductors will select together the participants for this project. The participants will be chosen so, that they complement each other. Finland and Italy will send mostly string players, Germany winds and percussionists. Each country will try to include every willing participant, but if a selection has to be made, the most committed players will have the priority. The selection process will be open and transparent. The criteria of the selection will be openly published before the selection. The participants will be chosen among the adult amateur musicians playing instruments needed in the project and having sufficient potential to meet successfully the instrumental and social qualifications to play in a high level international orchestra.

The administrative leaders will regurarly hold video conferences and stay in touch throughout the project and will make the practical arrangements in cooperation. Finland and Germany will take the organizational responsibility of the transnational meetings in their countries.

The grant requested under the item 'Project Management and Implementation' is needed for implementing the following measures:

1. Creating a Security Plan and assure that it is followed in the project. Iisalmen kansalaisopisto is the responsible partner in this. The content of the plan is described in the chapter "Project management".

2. Creating and offering a 10-hour personal study package to every adult music learner taking part in the project. Creating educational video material for adult learners to help each of them in learning his/her own instrumental part of the orchestra compositions. The responsible actor in this is Italy, being the pedagogic coordinator of the project at the same time. FONDAZIONE SCUOLA DI MUSICA DI FIESOLE ONLUS has a long experience in adult education and teaching adult amateurs in mixed ensembles together with professional musicians.

3. Creating and implementing a monitoring plan about the pedagogical and methological outcome of the project. The content of the plan is described in the chapter Project management. The Jugendmusikschule Württembergisches Allgäu is the responsible partner in this.

4. Creatig and realizing a dissemination plan. The content of the plan is described in the chapter "Dissemination and Use of Project's Results". lisalmen kansalaisopisto is the responsible partner in this.

5. Taking care of the finance and budget of the project according to the principles described under the question handling of risks in the chapter Project management. Iisalmen kansalaisopisto is responsible for this.

6. Paying the rent of the concert halls during the concert periods, paying the loan of the musical scores, paying the royalties, advertising the concerts in local newspapers and the traveling to other concert venues outside lisalmi and Wangen.

7. Ticket income of the concerts will be collected to cover the costs of essential professional musicians hired to assist the orchestra in the concerts. The rest will be used to cover the traveling expenses of the teenage music school students outside this adult project, who will take part in the concert periods abroad together with the adults funded from this GIFt project.



Transnational Project Meetings

Transnational project meetings: how often do you plan to meet, who will participate in those meetings, where will they take place and what will be the goal?

The project consist of one transnational kick-off meeting in Finland, followed by two learning events in Germany (Wangen im Allgäu) and in Finland (lisalmi). The original idea was to have a third learning event in Italy (Fiesole), but unfortunately we had to give up that idea, due to the hard hit of corona virus, which made Italy an epicenter of this global pandemic. At this moment it is understandable that the Italians don't have strenght or possibility to plan an Italian event. However, a plan of European cooperation gives them optimism, a goal and hope for the future. Italy will nonetheless equally be involved in this project and share the responsibilities of planning and creating educational material.

The project leaders together with the leading teacher of the project in each country will take part in the kick-off meeting. During the following Learning Events these same persons will join the participating adult amateur musicians as assisting persons together with one or two other essential teachers.

An organisational transnational kick-off meeting will be held in preparation of the two Learning Events taking place in Germany and in Finland. The kick-off meeting will be held in Finland and 2 participants from Germany and 2 participants from Italy will attend this meeting. During this meeting the leading persons of this project will get to know each other, get to know the location and the orchestra in lisalmi, create an educational plan for the preparation of the transnational meetings and will put together an exact plan of the activities for the two orchestral meetings in Germany and in Finland.

The goal of each meeting is to organize a rehearsal period for the orchestra followed by concerts. The first concerts will take place in Germany in 23.4.2021 (Leutkirch), 24.4.2021 (Isny), and 25.4.2021 (Wangen). The second concert period will be in lisalmi, Finland in September 2021.

Project Management

How will the monitoring of the project activities be carried out and by whom?

Creating and implementing a monitoring plan about the pedagogical and methological outcome of the project will be at the responsibility of the Jugendmusikschule Württembergisches Allgäu.

The music school will create a model for a learning diary, which every participant will keep during this project. With this diary we will monitor the individual learning in different areas of this project:

- instrumental skills
- orchestral playing
- following the conductor
- interpreting and understanding the music
- improving of language skills and social competences
- mental training and stage fright

On the base of the online lecture, that the participating teachers get in the beginning of this project, we will create a learning diary, that the teachers will keep during the project. They will put in use the new educational methods they have acquired and monitor the the development of their students and their own development in adult education. They will test, if the theoretical knowledge can help in the practice of adult learning.

Each organisation will make a detailed description of their activities in the beginning of this project and will update it after each transnational meeting. The results and suggestions for improvement will be documented by Germany at the end of the project.

The management team, consisting of 2 persons from each country, will regurarly keep in touch via video conferences. The 3 transnational meeting and their outcomes will be documented by Germany.



How will you assess the success of your project?

Project will be successful when its main target has been realized; when the concert program is well prepared and performed, the project has succeeded in many ways.

A good performance is a result of many things:

- An exact and well thought-out project plan and concert program, which is makeable for all the participants.
- Orchestral material and studying advices are well prepared beforehand.
- Practicing period is effective and communication works between the leaders.

- Students have a good self-confidence and feel encouraged to perform; they have gotten useful advice from their teachers; they have learned to follow their conductor; they feel free to play with their new partners which means that communication has been successful despite linguistic or cultural differences.

- Audience enjoys the concerts. Good amount of audience means that marketing has been effective.

- With the concerts we can make the public aware of the hobby possibilities for adults and inspire other amateur musicians to join the orchestras.

Part of the successful project will be teachers' improving skills in adult pedagogy, as teachers are able to experiment and develop new learning practices and teaching methods in this project. This will happen partly by exchanging good practices between participanting teachers but also by creating completely new methods together. Students will keep a learning diary and give feedback on the different areas of the project (musical skills; cultural awareness; communication skills, including linguistic, social and cultural competence; allround well-being and motivation). Expanding the professional network of the teachers will also be an important part so that the exchange of good practices can continue after the project.

If this orchestra project encourages any music school to start adult music education or a community-orchestra, it will be a great achievement for the project.

What are your plans for handling risks which could happen during the project (e.g. delays, budget, conflicts, etc.)?

lisalmen kansalasopisto is the responsible actor in Risk Management and Financial Management.

Without any doubt the biggest risk forseen in this project is the coronavirus, which has put the most of Europe to a lockdown at the moment of this applicaton is written. So far Italy has been hit strongest with the virus closing the whole country at least for several months. Against the original plan we already had to skip the orchestra period in Italy and ease the responsibilities of Scuola di Fiosole because of the human catastrophe in Italy affecting everything there. However this clearifies the importance of the Erasmus+ program giving hope and a vision to the future through European solidarity and cooperation. In case the coronavirus restrictions continue, there's no other chance than to postpone the project activities. There's always a risk of the change of key persons inside the organisations. However, there's a lot of expertice available in these organisations and even all the key persons can be replaced during this relatively short project consisting of only two training events.

At the end lisalmen kansalaisopisto is responsible for the general and financial management. Iisalmi has a lot of experience in managing local and European projects and thanks to being part of the organisation of lisalmi City, the whole administrative and financial office with knowledge and transparently controlled policies will guarantee that the management will follow all the rules and regulations.

This is a multilevel project what comes to its objectives and results. On the educational level this project will create new, interesting ways for amateur musicians to continue playing their instrument in adulthood. Although the participating institutes are already experts on their own adult education field, they also need to further develop their activities and share their knowledge with their national and transnational partners.

The study package will be a new creation for the adult orchestra players during this project. Every participating school will create their own package, matching the needs of their participants. Every partner school is also obligated to organize online and video lessons for other partners as part of this package. After the project, adult students will assess the contents of their study package, and institutions will share their practices; which activities were usefull for the students and if the online or video lessons are a functional tool in the future. We are expecting revolutionary results from these shared lessons, and with this project we could create a unique, transnational network for music education.

Preparations for learning activities will improve the skills of both students and teachers in many ways.

When teachers / leaders are planning their country's part of the concert program (choosing a suitable piece for the orchestra, making some "nationally known" performance instructions and bowings...), they have to use their wide professional knowledge of the national orchestral music culture and share it with their international colleagues. This way every colleague will learn from Finnish / German / Italian music culture and can use this new knowledge in their work with music school students and adult learners in the future. The unique possibility of playing concerts abroad will motivate students to practice their instruments even harder and give them a chance to refreshen and develop their language skills. The common language of the "GIFt" orchestra will be English, but all participants will learn some basics of their partner's languages before the transnational meetings. This will increase the feeling of togetherness between these musicians from three nations. The Italian participants will also teach the pronouncing of musical vocabulary which is used all over the world in classical music.

Improving the language skills will continue in learning activities, when people are finally communicating together. Students will also learn musical communication when they work with new conductors and new playing partners. During the orchestral rehearsal periods in Germany and Finland, the participants will get feedback for their playing and development from the leaders and partners. We will organize feedback sessions for every instrumental section, where students make positive comments about their neighbor's playing. The teachers and leaders will give advice on how the students can easily develop their musical skills. These kind of feedback sessions will be an important part of the project, as they improve not only the musical skills of the students but also their self-confidence and fellowship, and they encourage them to speak a foreign language. Many scientific studies show, that playing together increases both musical and social skills and the all-round wellbeing of individuals.

Orchestra players rarely have the possibility to deepen the understanding of the music that they play, since the concert program changes in each season. With this project they have the unique possibility to perform the same concert program in 6 concerts and with that get a better understanding of the music. The orchestra can to mold together musically and also socially. There will be 4 months between the two transnational concert periods. In these months the participants will stay in touch and their instrumental and language skills will develop and they will form a deeper bond with the other participants.

Until now, the orchestras have operated mostly regionally and this project will have an enourmous value for the teachers and conductors, who founded the orchestras. With this international network they can share their knowledge and also their challenges about their orchestra's developing with the colleagues from the other countries.



How will you communicate and cooperate with your partners?

Communication and cooperation between the partner organizations will be guaranteed by lisalmen kansalaisopisto.

To permit a proper run of communications and information, the following tools have been chosen for use throughout the project:

- Use of e-mail;

- Use of the AdminProject platform (www.adminproject.eu). The proprietary platform provides a series of functions including "task" and "discussion" that, in real-time, allows each organization to share information, comment, make requests or ask questions regarding any specific part of the project;

- Skype or Teams for permitting meetings between single organizations and for virtual meetings amongst all partners. The latter will be held quarterly each year.

Within the goal of maintaining the collaboration and communications between organizations, three transnational meetings will be organized during the project:

First the kick-off meeting and then two simultaneously during the two learning events

The information will be shared and the partnership will be developed in a common way through the selected communications channels according to the agreed timelines and workloads.

During the preparations we have already noticed, that the communication and cooperation between these partners functions excellently. The leaders of this project work well together and by combining their creativity we will be able to create new innovative ideas.

Activity Description (including profile of participants per organisation, goals and results of the activity)

The first learning period will take place in Germany in April 2021. The participants from Finland and Italy will travel to Wangen im Allgäu in Germany on Sunday 18.4.2021. From Monday on the orchestra will rehearse daily and the period will culminate in concerts held on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

The "GIFt" orchestra in Germany will consist of:

- 40 musicians from Germany (Städteorchestra Württembergisches Allgäu) all instrument groups. 25 adult amateur players, 10 music school students and 5 or more teachers.
- 20 musicians from Finland, 10 adult amateur players, 6 music school students and 4 teachers.
- 7 musicians from Italy, 5 adult amateurs players and 2 teachers.

This learning period will include:

- Getting to know each other, as it is the first time, that the participants meet each other.
- 4 days of different orchestra rehearsals; sectional rehearsals, tutti-rehearsals for the whole orchestra, dress rehearsal.
- 3 high quality concerts in the region.
- Evaluating the methods and results of the first transnational meeting and planning the second meeting in Finland.
- Discussing learning methods for the participants, so that they can further develop their skills between the two transnational meetings.
- Free time activities for the participants, so that they get to know the local culture, people and region.

The three concerts will take place in:

- 24.4.2021 in Leutkirch in the Hall of Festhalle, audience capacity up to 500.
- 25.4.2021 in Isny in the hall of Kurhaus am Park, audience capacity 350.
- 26.4.2021 in Wangen in the Festsaal of Waldorfschule, audience capacity 732.

Activity Description (including profile of participants per organisation, goals and results of the activity)

The second learning period of this project will be held in Finland in September 2021, about four months after the first meeting in Germany. This period is important to have quite soon after the first period because:

1) concert program is still good in memory and can be easily refreshed

2) social communication between players of the orchestra will continue more easily after the short break.

Although the orchestra has had a practicing period and concerts in Germany, it doesn't mean that they won't need any practicing anymore; developing as a musician needs time abd deeper studying of the already learned music. This step we can rarely take with our orchestras because concert program is normally changed after every concert. Now we have periods before and after summer holiday season, so the time between will help musicians to cope with this quite heavy concert program. In addition it is good to remember that part of the orchestra members will change from the first meeting and the new members will need time to practice together.

Finnish orchestra Ylä-Savo Sinfonietta has mostly players in string instruments and that is why Finland will invite mostly wind, brass and percussion players from Germany and Italy to their transnational meeting.

The transnational orchestra in Finland will consist of:

- 40 Finnish players (15 adult amateur players + 10 music school students + 5 or more teachers)
- 20 German players (10 adult amateur players + 6 music school students + 4 teachers)
- 7 Italian players (5 adult amateur players + 2 teachers)

The Finnish activity week (seven days) will include:

- 4 days of orchestra rehearsals with feedback sessions.
- 3 high quality classical music concerts.
- Project evaluating and future planning (feedback, sharing of good practices) with teachers.
- Well organized free time activities for all the project members, which support all targets of the project.

Concerts with German - Italian - Finnish program:

- First concert for elementaty school students in lisalmi, Eino Säisä Hall
- Second concert in lisalmi, Eino Säisä Hall (open for everybody)
- Third concert in Kuopio, Kuopio Music Center's Concert Hall (open for everybody)

Eino Säisä Hall in lisalmi is the home stage of Ylä-Savo Sinfonietta and that is why it is important to have concerts there for local audience – in this way audience gets to know Sinfonietta's operating better. The final concert in Kuopio will be held in the biggest and also the most high quality hall during the whole project; Kuopio is the largest city in North Savo region and it will be great to finish the project there and show the results of the project to a broad audience. Ylä-Savo Sinfonietta is acting mostly in the area of six cities / municipalitys (Upper Savo). We're going to invite guests from Upper Savo area, including city mayors and business leaders. In addition we invite members from The Association of Finnish Music Schools and multiple group of principals and chiefs of adult education centers and music institutes of Eastern Finland .

Background In	



What is the added value of these Learning, Teaching or Training activities (including long-term activities) with regards to the achievement of the project objectives?

The Learning, Teaching or Training activities are the base, the goal and the highlight of this project.

In the transnational orchestra meetings the participants will be be able to test and put in use the skills they've learned during the preparations. They can further develop their instrumental and musical skills, learn new languages and cultures and get to know other amateur musicians. These meetings will strengthen their sense of vitality and give them a better knowledge of the human mind, as they get to know people from different cultures and are out of their accustomed living environment. The participating teachers will have the possibility to further educate themselves in andragogy and learn new methods they can put in use in their work in the future. The participating organizations get to exchange their knowledge and practices in the field of community-orchestra and adult education. Through that they can improve and extend the supply of learning opportunities for adults in their own institutions.

How will you select, prepare and support participants and ensure their safety? Please describe the practical arrangements including training, teaching or learning agreements, if applicable.

A board of leading teachers will choose the participants for the transnational meetings. They will try to ensure that as many possible willing participants can partake in this project. The participants for the orchestra periods we be chosen so, that they complement the needs of the host orchestra. For example Ylä-Savo Sinfonietta has a shortage of viola players, percussionists and wind players. The orchestras in Germany and Italy will send musicians from these instrumental groups. The participants have to have adequate instrumental and social skills and they have to be able to understand and communicate in English.

Each adult amateur musician will be provided with a minimum ten hours study package before the Learning activity. The committement to the project will also be supported by a naming a personal instrument teacher to the student as well as a professional mentor inside the orchestra. A common suitable social media group or groups will also be created with the idea of getting the students together and sharing ideas, opinions and experiences.

The sending organisation will make a mobility agreement with each adult student as the first thing in the beginning of the project. All the travel arrangements like buying travel tickets and booking accommodation will be done by the office of each sending organisation. The receiving organisation will be consulted in order to get the most suitable and safe solution for a best price.

Each sending organisation will ensure (and get if needed) that all the participants who will travel, have the proper essential insurances. One of the teachers traveling in the Learning Activity team will be a group leader with a mandate of the sending organisation to help in all risk or emergency situations.

Follow-up

Impact

What is the expected impact on the participants, participating organisations, target groups and other relevant stakeholders?

Through the intensive preparation, the participants will develop their musical skills and their motivation will grow. They will get to meet other amateur musicians from other countries and learn from their culture and music. The can make new social bonds, develop their language skills and increase their knowledge of human nature, when they deal with people from different cultures. Playing together in an intercultural and intergenerational orchestra will increase their wellbeing and self-esteem and give their hobby a meaningful purpose. The participating teachers will further educate themselves in andragogy and this way increase their ability to compete on the labour market. They will be part of a transnational network of educators, which will be helpful in the future challenges they face in their profession.

The participating organizations will get valuable input and will be able to further develop this orchestra model and the adult pedagogy in their own music school, region and country. With this interesting project we can inspire other adult amateurs to join the orchestras and through dissemination we can encougare other music institutions and others public bodies throughout Europe to use this orchestra model.



What is the desired impact of the project at the local, regional, national, European and/or international levels?

Local impacts:

- Increasing the popularity of orchestra playing and the amount of amateur players in music school activities.
- Developing operational models for adult amateur musicians.
- Developing the skills of the local teachers in adult learning.
- Offer high quality concerts for the local community.

- Offer cultural activities for local elementary schools students (the concert for them will be shorter from program, but it will be moderated and will include other factors, such as getting to know classical music, musical instruments and how a symphony orchestra works).

Regional impacts:

- Every orchestra operates in their own region giving a possibility to play regardless of the commune borders. After this project the idea of "community orchestra" will be more clear for local people.

-Additionally the same impacts than before in "local impacts"

National / European impacts:

- Creating an active model of community orchestra, that is viable mainly in smaller European cities and their neighborhoods.

- Interactions between teachers and amateur players of participating countries will continue after the project.

For example sharing of good practices or tips of playable program from national repertoire will be a thing, that the teachers need also in the future (programming for this kind of orchestra is often a lot of work, where other teachers could help a lot with their knowledge of different kind of repertoire).



How will you measure the previously mentioned impacts?

Impact will be measured mostly in qualitative but also in quantitative ways.

All participants will keep a learning diary troughout the project; students and teachers have their own version of a learning diary.

With the help of these diaries it is easier to measure how people evaluate their skills, feelings and motivation during the process. Teachers will write down all the feedback that they get from students during local preparation and international learning periods; this way we can see development in individuals and get important information of positive and negative long-term impacts of the project. Teachers will evaluate their improving in andragogical skills: their development in adult pedagogics will mostly happen in a practical way – learning from each other and getting feedback from the students. They will compare the theory they've learned to the practice in order to discover, if the scientific research can be used in praxis of adult music education.

The visible (and hearable) part of the project are six concerts, held in Germany and Finland.

We will make videos from at least the first and the last concert, so that every member of the orchestra can notice their development in musical and performance skills. Concerts are the public part of the project and will show the impacts of international cooperation for a large amount of people. GIFt-orchestra will have an audience of about 3000 people, so the locals who are interested in classical music will be made aware of the amateur orchestras operating in their area. The visibility through a high quality performance is the best marketing form and the best way to get new members to join the activities. All the partners will demonstrate the impacts of the project on their own field regionally and nationally. We definitely hope, that amateur musicians will have better hobby activities in whole Europe little by little.

This project will touch directly about 60 amateur musicians and 20 teachers (including persons who are not travelling but will join to their home county's activities) and also about 30 young music students. The adolescents have an important part in this project because this way they learn, that orchestra playing can be a lifelong hobby also for them.

Which activities will you and your partner carry out in order to share the results of your project beyond your partnership?

Communication and Dissemination plan suggests the usage of the following channels:

- PROMOTIONAL MATERIAL:

COORDINATED IMAGE project manual, which will codify the style and tone of communication and the guidelines for engagement. The following will be realized:

LOGO to be utilized for all of the communication activities. The official logo of the concerts' organisators and the logo of the European Commission will be used.

BROCHURE to provide fundamental information about the project and its goals, about the partners, the activities and their results. The brochure will contain the project logo, a brief description of the expected goals, a list of the partners with their respective logos, the Erasmus+ logo and the URL of the project website. It will be written in English and be forwarded electronically for further dissemination to the mailing lists and databases of each partner institution, stakeholder, etc., and eventually in printed form for the relevant events in each location.

A BANNER on the homepages of each partner's websites. The same banner can furthermore be published on any eventual portal of interested entities within the music sector. A PERIODICAL NEWSLETTER (to be released after each concert period) specifically aimed toward stakeholders and target groups. It will contain the headlines of the events and specific information regarding the project's activities and will be compiled in English.

PERIODICALS/PRESS COMMUNICATIONS: each partner will try to activate the main local newspapers and online posts to be used as dissemination channels of the project. COMMUNICATION AND ONLINE PRESENCE:

The WEBSITE will be the main dissemination channel of the project. On the web site all of the useful project experiences and results will be shared work. The website will contain links to the official websites of the partners.

SOCIAL NETWORK like Facebook and YouTube: this social media will also allow the sharing of the project's activities, the transnational mobilities and the dissemination events. However, the project will aim to involve students and their colleagues in these dissemination activities. This will be done according to a bottom-up approach: collecting comments, testimonies and audio/video recordings of the studying process of students in each country as well as during the transnational meetings. The participating institutions pay a special attention that the European laws and regulations concerning the treatment of personal data and information will be followed.

lisalmen kansalaisopisto will manage the communication and dissemination activities of the project. This Finnish adult education center will also collect a virtual communication team composed by one person from each partner organization.

lisalmen kansalaisopisto is part of the organisation of lisalmi city and this allows the GIFt project to get help from the lisalmi city marketing office in creating and developing informative materials and managing promotional campaigns. With the help of the professional staff of this marketing office, lisalmen kansalaisopisto will coordinate the communication activities between the partners and will assist in the organization of events and specific actions within the involved territories, with the intention to promote and augment the exposure of the project. The actions will include:

- CREATING PROMOTIONAL MATERIAL – printed and digital: assisting in the collection of content; assisting in creation of graphic drafts and informative/promotional material; inserting informative content in the drafts created.

- DISTRIBUTION OF PRODUCED MATERIALS: assisting in choosing the content to produced materials; helping in the distribution of the materials produced.

- DEVELOPMENT OF INFORMATIVE WEB CHANNEL: collaborating in updating the online content, elaborating on other focused communications (newsletters, promo videos); sending informational web-posts about project's events and disseminating the results of the project.

- HELPING IN MAKING PROMOTION AND DISSEMINATION PLAN FOR THE EVENTS:

helping the partners in the dissemination of each event; reviewing the contents of each event; producing publicity materials; collaborating in defining the strategic steps to ensure success of the event.

How will you ensure that the project's results will remain available and will be used by others?

During the project a Basic model of the way how adult music students will be offered a possibility to take part in symphony orchestra periods together with professional players and teenager music school students will be created and tested. The music education system differs in different European countries and that's why this Basic model will be modified suitable for each country during the project. This means that at the end this project offers three different solutions how to build up a common symphony orchestra of professionals, music school students and adult amateurs. All the result materials will be openly shared on the website of the project. The results will also be shared on the European EPALE-platform of changing the good practices. The national music school network organisations are also an important channel to share the knowledge obtained. Each partner will also organise a video conference for sharing the results in addition to using social media like Facebook, YouTube and Twitter to attrack the interest of other music schools and give them the opportunity to supply possibilities for adult amateurs in their orchestra playing activities.

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Sustainability

What are the activities and results that will be maintained after the end of the EU funding, and how will you ensure the resources needed to sustain them?

The most important sustainable result ist the improved community-orchestra model we create in this project. Each participating institution will continue its orchestra work and offer yearly two orchestra periods in which the adult amateurs can participate. The achieved outcomes and ideas of the project will be put into practice and this model can become a solid part of the music school curriculum. With the help of digital media we will create an educational network of teachers, conductors and adult amateurs. This provides the possibility, that the partners can support and help each other also in the future. The best possible outcome is, that the cooperation will continue long in to the future on many levels.

Three different methods (one for each country Finland, Germany, Italy) how to involve adult amateur students in symphony orchestras will be documented and shared for the use of anybody interested. These methods will be used afterwards not only in the participating music institutions, but they will also be shared in each country and within Europe through the EPALE-platform and the networks of each participating institute.

An important result beside the measurable activities are the meaningful experiences and increasing of human capital on an individual level.
