We all got to see the boat from the inside.

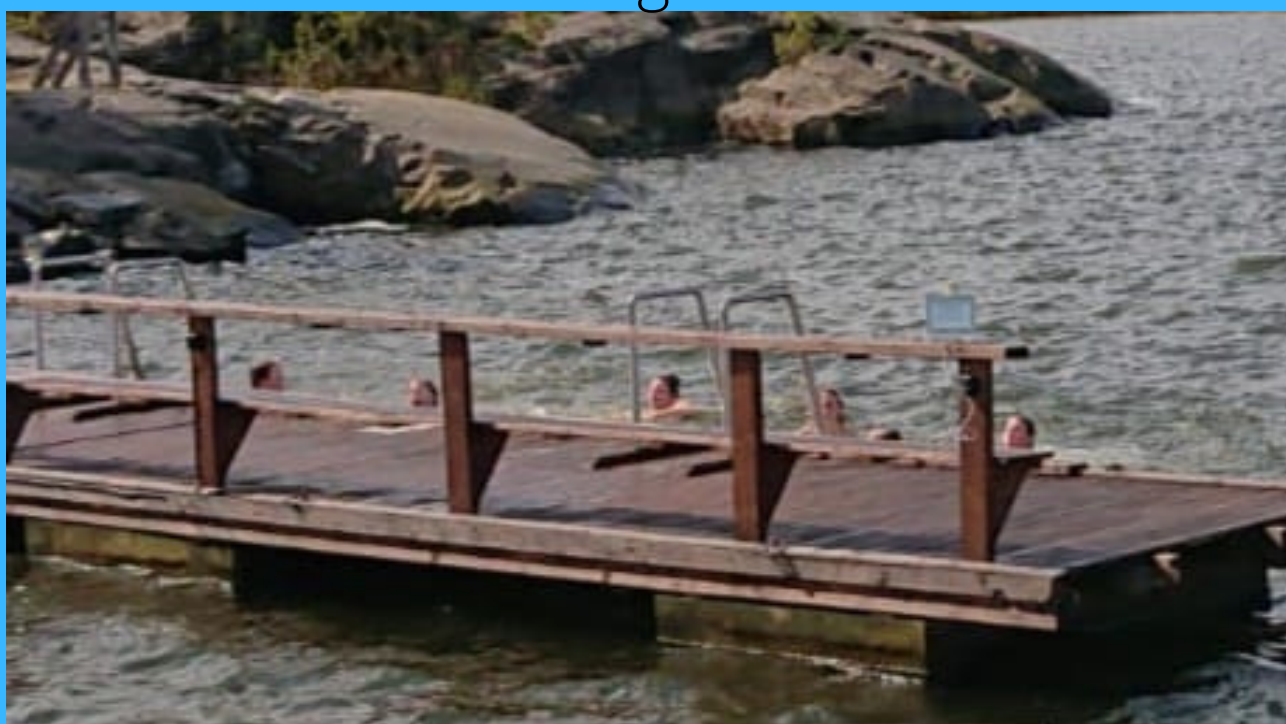


## Salmon soup
