The duration of studies



- The school year is divided into five periods.
- During one period the student studies 5 to 7 courses.
- The studies usually last 3 years, but they can be extended up to 4 years if
 - the student chooses a lot of extra courses
 - hobbies take a lot of time

Courses

- The subjects are divided into courses of 18-20 lessons.
- The length of a single lesson is 75 minutes.
- 75 courses are required for the school leaving certificate .
- All students choose their own courses.
- Courses are divided into
 - obligatory
 - advanced
 - applied

Obligatory courses



- the same in all upper secondary schools in Finland
- 47 courses if the student has chosen Intermediate Mathematics
- 51 courses if the student has chosen Advanced Mathematics
- The number of obligatory courses in different subjects e.g.
 - Advanced Mathematics: 10 courses
 - Physics, Chemistry, Philosophy, Psychology and Health Education 1 course each



Advanced courses



- the same in all upper secondary schools in Finland
- at least 10 must be chosen
- the choice is made according to one's own interests or plans for further studies



The schools own courses include

- The Baltic Sea Course (includes a camping weekend)
- Hiking (wilderness skills, orientation, knowledge of nature)
- Sound Sculpture (combines Arts and Music)
- History of Motion Pictures
- International projects
- Learning to learn
- Tutoring
- Lab courses in Physics and Chemistry
- Animation
- Courses in Physical Education
- School Paper
- Revision courses for students before the matriculation exams
